ODU defeated cross state rival Virginia Tech, 94-92 in overtime. Isaiah Hunter (equaling his career high)led with 21 points, and John Waller added 18. Five Monarchs scored in double figures. Senior Troy Nance tied The game at the buzzer with a 30-foot shot to send it to overtime. ODU shot .474 from the floor and .861 from the line. It was the Monarchs first ever win in Cassell Coliseum in eight tries.

DID YOU KNOW

In 1994-95, ODU played four top-25 teams. The Monarchs defeated #9 Villanova, 89-81 in triple overtime in the NCAA first round. During the Regular season, ODU played at #14 Virginia, and #14 Arizona State and Host #1 North Carolina .

This year, the Monarchs have played two teams in the top 25 in #9North Carolina and #13 St. Joseph's.

The 21, 750 at the North Carolina game last Saturday was the largest Crowd the Monarchs have played before. The previous high was the 19,320 on Dec. 27, 1986 at UNLV.

Assistant coach Jim Corrigan is in his 17th year as an assistant on the Collegiate level, all in the CAA.

Assistant coach Rob Wilkes is the son of legendary Stetson head Coach Glenn Wilkes.

Assistant coach Travis DeCuire played for Taylor at Montana from 1991-94 and earned All-Big Sky honors in 1993 and 1994.

Of the eight Monarchs who have played in the NBA, two were first round draft picks. Chris Gatling (16th overall in 1991 by Golden State) and Cal Bowdler (17th overall in 1999 by Atlanta). Gatling played in the 1997 NBA all-star game. Both are currently playing overseas (Gatling in Russia & Bowdler in Italy)

This year's co-captains are seniors John Waller, Troy Nance and sophomore Alex Loughton.

MONARCH RECRUITING

ODU signed 6-5 forward Jason Thompson from Chatham Central High School in Bear Creek, NC. The Yadkin Valley Conference Player of the Year as a sophomore and runner-up last year averaged 21.3 points and 9.7 rebounds per game last year. He has scored 1,401 career points and hauled in 693 career rebounds. Chatham was 22-5 last year.

HOOSIERS

Phil Raisor, an associate professor of English at ODU was on the losing side of two of the most storied basketball games ever played. He started at guard for the heavily-favored Muncie Central Bearcats, who fell in the 1954 Indiana state championship to Tiny Milan, the David-over-Goliath event that inspired the 1986 file "Hoosiers." Raisor was also a teammate of Wilt Chamberlain at the University of Kansas when they lost the triple overtime NCAA title game in 1957. His new book "Outside Shooter" chronicles that historic high school game and Raisor will be on hand on Dec. 13 (vs. Morgan State) for a book signing before the game and at halftime. A portion of the proceeds from book Sales that night will support the ODU Intercollegiate Foundation for athletic scholarships.
