STORY LINES:

- Old Dominion Football is in its fourth season overall and final year in the Colonial Athletic Association. After falling to Villanova at homecoming, Old Dominion has won three-straight, including a 53-27 thrashing at Georgia State last week.
- The Monarchs lead all FCS schools in Scoring Offense (45.5), Total Offense (564.4), and rank second in passing offense (394.9). Additionally quarterback Taylor Heinicke leads the nation in total offense at 428.2 yards a game and in passing yards per game with 390.0, while wide receiver Nick Mayers is 19th in receiving yards at 92.0 yards per contest.
- Sophomore quarterback Taylor Heinicke has received national attention following the game with New Hampshire which saw the signal caller set an NCAA All-Division record in Total Offense in a Game, a Division I record in passing yards in a game, and FCS records in Total Offense in a Half, Passing Offense in a Half, and Total Offense and Passing Yards in a Quarter.
- In the win at GSU, Heinicke became ODU's all-time leader in completions, passing yards and touchdowns, passing former Monarch Thomas DeMarco in all categories.
- After throwing zero touchdown passes for the first time all season last week against Delaware, Heinicke tossed three TD passes in the win at Georgia State to continue leading the nation with 27 on the year.
- Sophomore Tyree Lee rushed for 126 yards on a career-high 25 carries in the win at GSU, his second-straight game over 100-yards.
- For the first time this season, the ODU defense shutout an opponent in the first half, pitching a shutout against GSU over the first two quarters.
- Old Dominion will honor 17 seniors before the final regular season home game Saturday against W&M. ODU will honor: Alex Arain, Kai Blanco, Chris Burnette, Brandon Carr, Michael Colbert, Fred Credle, Robbie Duncan, Chris Lovitt, Nick Mayers, BJ McLaughlin, Nate Ong, Perry Owens, Jonathan Plisco, Carvin Powell, Erik Saylor, Devon Simmons and Craig Wilkins.

"The Quick Hits"

- Since restarting its football team in 2009, Old Dominion has compiled a four-year total of 35 wins and only nine losses. In the 2011 season, the Monarchs finished the year at 10-3 overall and ranked No. 10 in both The Sports Network/Fathead.com and FCS Coaches Final Polls.

- In its first season of conference play ODU went 6-2 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), a league that sent five teams to the post-season. The Monarchs, picked to finish 10th in the CAA Preseason Poll, ended the year in a tie for second place in the conference.

- ODU advanced to its first ever post-season appearance and advanced to the second round of the FCS playoffs. In the first round, ODU defeated cross-town rival and MEAC Champion, Norfolk State, 35-18, and the playoff run ended with a 55-48 loss to #3/2 Georgia Southern.

- It took the Monarchs until year three and its 27th game to receive its first Top 25 FCS ranking on October 3, 2011 coming in at No. 21 in The Sports Network Poll. The Monarchs finished the 2011 campaign ranked 10th in both The Sports Network and FCS Coaches Poll and comes into Saturday ranked No. 4 in The Sports Network Poll and No. 4 in the FCS Coaches Poll.

- Old Dominion's home field of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium, which holds 20,068, has sold out all 24 of its games to date, including all home games in 2012. ODU fans purchased more than 14,000 season tickets for the 2012 season. The Monarchs are 20-6 all-time and went 6-1, including a first round FCS playoff game victory, in 2011 at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. They are currently 4-1 at home on the year with the 57-23 season opening win over Duquesne, 70-14 victory against Campbell, and record setting 64-61 CAA opening victory over #18/19 New Hampshire.

- The Monarchs made history on September 5th, 2009 when a three-year dream became a reality. On May 31, 2006, the ODU board of visitors voted to add football and 1,293 days later, the Monarchs kicked off their first season of Division I FCS play. ODU played an 11-game schedule, including seven home dates at the \$24.8 million renovated Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The schedule was a mix of both D-II and D-I FCS opponents to help the Monarchs transition into not only its first year of football, but also to get ready for entering the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in 2011, the toughest FCS conference in the nation.

- After playing two years as an independent in the FCS, the Monarchs joined the CAA, considered by many to be the best FCS conference in the nation in 2011. After no selections on the preseason all-conference team and picked to finish 10th in the preseason poll, Old Dominion tied for second in league play with a 6-2 CAA record and had 11 Monarchs honored on All-CAA teams.

- On May 17th, Old Dominion announced it would elevate its football program to the FBS level joining Conference USA. The Monarchs will play in the CAA in 2012 and while not eligible for the CAA Championship, the Monarchs are still eligible for the FCS playoffs via an at-large bid. ODU will be a transitional FCS team in 2013, a transitional FBS team in 2014, and a full Conference USA member in football in 2015 eligible for a bowl game.

RISING UP THE RANKS:

It took the ODU Football Monarchs until year three and 27 games to receive its first Top 25 ranking on October 3, 2011, coming in at No. 21 in The Sports Network Poll. Looking at other recent start-up programs, it took Coastal Carolina 32 games to achieve a national ranking when they came in at No. 24 in The Sports Network Poll in their third year on Nov. 8, 2005. That season the Chanticleers finished 9-2 and were the Big South co-champions. The Monarchs enter Saturday ranked No. 5 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 5 in The Sports Network Poll.

WELCOME TO THE TOP 25:

The Football Monarch have been a member of the Top-25 for the last 17 weeks in the The Sports Network Poll and the last 15 weeks of the FCS Coaches Poll dating back to last season. ODU has been member of the Top-10 for the last 12 weeks dating back to last season.

In another first for the ODU Football program, the Monarchs were ranked in the Top-25 for the first time in school history coming in at No. 21 in The Sports Network/Fathead.com FCS Top-25 College Football Poll following a 48-33 win over then-#20 UMass, the Monarchs first ever CAA and Top-25 victory. Following ODU's 31-23 victory over Rhode Island the next weekend, ODU made its FCS Coaches Poll debut during week seven coming in at No. 22. ODU steadily moved up the ranks until it cracked the Top-10 at the conclusion of the season with a 35-31 win at nearby William & Mary to end the regular season on a four-game win streak and a 9-2 overall and a 6-2 record in its inaugural season of CAA play.

MOST AND LEAST:

The 70 points scored by the Monarchs in week three against Campbell set a record for most points in a game. The 70 points surpassed the previous record of 57 tied in week one in the 57-23 victory over Duquesne along with the Monarchs' 57-9 victory over Savannah State on November 6, 2010. ODU added to the list in the week four CAA opener with 64 points against New Hampshire.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS:

Taylor Heinicke put his name all over the game passing records in the week one win over Duquesne.

- Heinicke's 492 yards passed the previous high of 407 yards by Thomas DeMarco at Monmouth on September 25, 2010 and his previous high of 373 against Richmond back on November 5, 2011.

- Heinicke's 41 completions passed the previous high of 34 which he had set against Richmond on November 5, 2011.

- Heinicke's 63 attempts replaced the previous high of 57 attempts made by Thomas DeMarco against Cal Poly in 2010 and his own previous high of 47 against Richmond on November 5, 2011.

- Heinicke also set school mark with 530 yards of total offense (492 pass, 38 rush) with a record 74 plays. He surpasses his previous record of 421 yards of total offense against Richmond back on November 5, 2011 and the previous high of 73 plays set by former Monarch Thomas DeMarco against Cal Poly on October 9, 2010.

In week three against Campbell, Heinicke found another place to put his name.

- Heinicke reset his own school record for touchdown passes in a game with seven in the victory over Campbell. Heinicke surpassed the previous record of five TD passes in both of last year's playoff games vs. Norfolk State on Nov. 26, 2011 and at Georgia Southern on Dec. 3, 2011.

- The quarterback's passing yards were the 10th-highest total in CAA Football history, while his seven TD-passes were one shy from equaling the league mark last done in 2004.

Then in week four against New Hampshire in the CAA Opener, the ODU, FCS, and Division I record books blew up.

PASSING YARDS IN A QUARTER: Heinicke's 293-yard fourth quarter eclipsed the FCS record of 284 set by Western Illinois' Sam Clemons in the second quarter versus Indiana State in 2001.

PASSING YARDS IN A HALF: Heinicke's 480-yard second half dismantled the FCS record of 383 set by Marshall's Michael Payton in the first half against VMI in 1991. The Division I record is 517 by Houston's Andre Ware against SMU in 1989.

PASSING YARDS IN A GAME: As noted Saturday, Heinicke's 730 yards bests the Division I record of Houston's David Klingler, who threw for 716 against Arizona State in 1990, but just misses the all-division record of 736 by Sam Durley of Eureka College (DII) in a 62-55 comeback win over Knox College earlier this season. The FCS record was 624 by Weber State's Jamie Martin against Idaho State in 1991.

PASSES IN A GAME WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION: Heinicke's 79 breaks the all-division record of 77 set by Justin Peery of Division III Westminster of Missouri against MacMurray in 1998. The Division I record of 76 was shared by Eastern Michigan's Andy Schmitt (versus Temple in 2008) and Houston's Case Keenum (against UTEP in 2009).

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A QUARTER: Heinicke's 293 yards in the fourth, all through the air, breaks the FCS record of 278 set by Mississippi Valley State's Willie Totten in the second quarter against Kentucky State in 1984.

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A HALF: Heinicke had 496 after intermission (480 passing, 16 rushing), lapping the FCS record of 404 set by Stephen F. Austin's Todd Hamel in the first quarter against Louisiana-Monroe in 1989.

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A GAME: Also as noted Saturday, Heinicke's 791 yards (730 passing, 61 rushing) are an NCAA record, besting Klingler's 732 (716 passing, 16 rushing) versus Arizona State in 1990. The FCS record was 668 by Jackson State's Robert Kent (595 passing, 73 rushing) against Alabama State in 2001.

KEEPING PACE: If the season were to end today, Heinicke would finish third on the all-time single-season FCS charts for passing yards per game with 390.00 and in total offense per game with 428.22

A RECORD NOT TO BE OVER LOOKED EITHER:

Blair Roberts' three touchdown receptions against the Camels in week three were the most by a Monarch in a game in ODU's 38-game history and Nick Mayers tied the record in week four with a trio of TDs in the win over New Hampshire.

Mayers and redshirt sophomore Antonio Vaughan also tied the school record with 12 receptions in the week four game with New Hampshire.

AND LET'S NOT FORGET THESE RECORDS TOO:

These were also records set in week four against New Hampshire:

FIRST DOWNS PASSING: The Monarchs' 37 breaks the Division I record of 33 set by Idaho against Middle Tennessee State in 2001. Montana owned the FCS record, with 32 versus Weber State in 1999.

COMBINED FIRST DOWNS: ODU (39) and New Hampshire (35) had 74, breaking the FCS record of 72 set by Bethune-Cookman (40) and Howard (32) in 1987. Houston (40) and Louisiana Tech (48) set the Division I record of 78 two weeks ago.

COMBINED TOTAL OFFENSE: The Monarchs (825) and Wildcats (724) teamed for 1,529 yards, crushing the FCS mark of 1,423 held by Murray State (816) and Missouri State (607) since 2010. But Murray State and Missouri State set their record in a mere 134 plays (10.6 yards per snap), while ODU and New Hampshire had 195 (7.8 yards per play). The all-divisions record is 1,640 yards set by San Jose State (849) and Nevada (791) in 2001.

BLOCK THAT KICK:

Special teams has 25 blocks to its credit in its four seasons, including a pair of blocked PATs this season

The first of the 2012 campaign was a blocked PAT by senior Erik Saylor in the season opener with Duquesne. It was Saylor's second blocked PAT of his career.

Chris Burnette captured a blocked extra point attempt at Richmond in week five mid-way through the fourth quarter. It was the first blocked PAT for Burnette who previously had denied five field goal attempts during his Monarch career.

Last season, the Monarchs made 11 blocked kicks, which according to an unofficial poll of FCS schools led the nation for the most blocks by a school last season.

- Erik Saylor blocked Georgia Southern's Adrian Mora's extra point attempt to snap his streak of 151 consecutive made PATs which was an FCS record in the second round of the FCS playoffs.

- Chris Burnette blocked his third field goal of the year and fifth of his career on a 37-yard attempt by Norfolk State in the first round of the FCS playoffs. In addition to thwarting field goals against William & Mary and Delaware earlier in the year, Burnette stopped a 37-yard field-goal attempt by Virginia Union and a 32-yard attempt by Presbyterian back in 2009.

- Former Monarch Edmon McClam, who holds NCAA Division I record for most blocked PAT's by a single player in a game (FCS or FBS) with three against Chowan in the inaugural game in 2009, was just one blocked PAT shy of tying the FCS record for blocked extra points in a career. He blocked his first field goal attempt on a 50-yard Spartan attempt by Norfolk State in the first round of the FCS playoffs.

- In week 10, Jakwail Bailey blocked his second punt of the 2011 season against Richmond. In week five, Jakwail Bailey blocked a UMass punt that results in a safety, giving the Monarchs a 26-25 lead they would not relinquish late in the third quarter. For his efforts, Bailey was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week.

- In week nine, Craig Wilkins blocked a 47-yard James Madison field goal attempt in last moments of ODU's 23-20 win over the Dukes leading the Monarchs to their first Top 10 victory in school history.

- In week three's game with Hampton true freshman James Faircloth blocked a Pirate punt resulting in Larry Pinkard returning the ball five-yards for a touchdown to open up the fourth quarter in the 45-42 victory. It was the third time in the two-game series with the Pirates that ODU has blocked a punt attempted by Hampton.

- In week two's 40-17 win at Georgia State, Alex Arain blocked his second career punt that was picked up by Blair Roberts and returned for a touchdown. Additionally, Paul Morant blocked a punt in the victory.

HOME/AWAY:

Old Dominion is currently 19-6 all-time and 3-1 this season on its home turf of Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The Monarchs had won six-straight on its home turf until last week's homecoming loss to Villanova.

ODU is 14-3 all-time on the road. Last season, the Monarchs went 4-2 on the road in 2011 with losses at Delaware and Georgia Southern, with both teams being ranked in the nation's top-10 at the time of play.

The Monarchs improved to 2-0 all-time against Hampton at Armstrong Stadium in the week two 45-7 win over the Pirates. ODU will also be returning to the Georgia Dome where they defeated the Panthers last season, 40-17.

Old Dominion will be making road trips to Richmond, Towson, and James Madison for the first times.

ANOTHER IT'S A MOST MOMENT:

In last season's contest with the Pirates, Craig Wilkins led the ODU defense with 17 tackles replacing his previous high of 11 stops in the 2010 game with nationally-ranked Cal Poly. It still stands as a record for stops by a Monarch

defender in a game, replacing the previous high of 14 by Ronnie Cameron set in the 2010 season finale at N.C. Central.

While Wilkins didn't best his mark against Hampton, he did lead the defense with nine tackles, including three for loss, and a seven-yard sack that resulted in a forced fumble.

RAIN, RAIN GO AWAY:

Old Dominion has been very lucky when it comes to weather, having only encountered rain in five of its 38-games to date over the last four seasons.

In another first for the program, the Monarchs had their first weather delay and shortened contest in week two at Hampton as the game was called with 11:43 remaining in the fourth quarter. Lightening entered the area forcing the teams into the locker room and both teams agreed to call the game at that point with inclement weather surrounding the area for much of the night.

The Monarchs defeated Delaware in the 2012 Oyster Bowl 31-26 in a rain storm for the majority of three quarters. A steady rain hit the Hampton Roads area, and really started to come down in the last five minutes of the game.

Last season, the Monarchs played two games in the rain and won both - a 45-42 win over Hampton on Sept. 17th and a 23-20 win over James Madison in the revival of the Oyster Bowl on Oct. 29th. The win over the Dukes also gave ODU its first ever win over a top-10 program.

In 2009 ODU defeated Campbell, 28-17, on an overcast and drizzling October 17, 2009 afternoon at Foreman Field while a comeback against Fordham fell short, 34-29, at a soggy Jack Coffey Field on Oct 3, 2009 in other inclement weather contests.

- Sophomore Tyree Lee ran for 100-yards for the second-straight game and third time this season. He registered a career-best 25 carries and was just two-yards shy of his career-high last of 128 against Delaware, rushing for 126 and two scores.

- Nick Mayers caught five passes for 52-yards and a TD at GSU, pushing his school record for consecutive games with a catch to 18.

Football Monarchs Victorious in Battle of the Silver Mace

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. - The No. 11 Old Dominion Football Monarchs concluded the 2011 regular season at 9-2 overall and 6-2 in Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) action with its 35-31 victory over William & Mary at Zable Stadium on Saturday and are now looking towards the playoffs in only their third season of play.

The Monarchs won the inaugural "Battle for the Silver Mace" and were presented a replica of the Norfolk Mace at the end of the contest.

Angus Harper, who finished the game with a trio of touchdowns, broke tackle on a seven-yard run with just under three minutes remaining in the game to give the Monarchs the 35-31 edge and corner Eriq Lewis, back after missing the last three games with a high ankle sprain, intercepted a pair of passes from Brent Caprio in the Tribes' final two drives in the closing minutes of the game.

After recovering a William & Mary fumble in their own end zone and keeping the Tribe deep in their own territory on the next time down the field, ODU opened up scoring. The Monarchs needed just four plays to cover 58 yards and go up 7-0 at the 4:27 mark. Starting their first scoring drive from their own 42, Taylor Heinicke connected with Larry Pinkard for a five-yard gain and followed by hitting Mayers for a 31-yard reception to the Tribe 11. Angus Harper then ran 11-yards to collect his seventh touchdown of the 2011 campaign to put ODU up 7-0.

William & Mary tied the game up at 7-7 on the ensuing possession to close out first quarter action. Leading rusher Jonathan Grimes, who ended the game day 227 yards on 38 carries, tore downfield for 25 yards to the left corner of the end zone for the first score on the day for the Tribe.

Heinicke, the three-time CAA Rookie of the Week, put the Monarchs back on top running and spinning into the end zone with the second quarter drive start. Making his third rushing touchdown of the season at the 12:15 mark of the second quarter, Heinicke saw the Monarchs use seven plays over 60 yards to take the lead 14-7.

However, just like Old Dominion's first score, the Tribe answered. Grimes punched in his second touchdown of the game with 8:53 remaining in the second quarter.

Old Dominion had a chance to go ahead at the half with a 57-yard field goal attempt by Jarod Brown. The field goal, which would have been Browns' career mark, was blocked by Quincey Septemeber and the teams went into the intermission tied at 14-14.

The Tribe kicked off scoring in the third quarter. William & Mary took nearly five and half minutes on the drive to go ahead 21-14 for its first lead of the game. D.J. Managas capped the 11-play, 79-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown reception at the back of the end zone.

Old Dominion answered pulling out another play from its bag of tricks. Wide receiver Antonio Vaughan threw a 27-yard pass to Reid Evans tie the game up at 21-21 with 6:49 on the clock.

William & Mary made its way deep into ODU territory to close out the third quarter and continued its possession into the fourth quarter with Grimes pushing his way over the end line for his third touchdown of the season. Tying his career mark, he gave the Tribe a 28-21 advantage with 12:36 left in the game.

The Tribe's lead only lasted one minute and 43 seconds though. The Monarchs quickly got the ball down field in six plays thanks and ended with Angus Harper posting his second touchdown of the day.

Harper carried the ball five times accounting for 42 of the Monarchs' following 74 yard drive resulting in the redshirt freshman's third and game-winning touchdown. The ODU charge downfield that gave ODU the 35-31 edge was aided by a 15-yard reception by Nick Mayers, and Hensley recovering a fumble by the Monarchs inside the red zone.

There was still time on the clock though for William & Mary to use. The Tribe had 2:48 to work with and got to within striking distance at the Monarchs' own 33. However, Tribe quarterback Brent Caprio's pass landed in the hands of Eriq Lewis.

Football Monarchs Take Rain Shortened 45-7 Victory over Hampton

HAMPTON, Va. -- #7/5 Old Dominion rattled off 31 unanswered points and held Hampton to just one touchdown score in the Football Monarchs' 45-7 victory over the Pirates in a rain shorten game on Saturday night at Armstrong Stadium.

The win improved the Monarchs to 2-0 on the year, while the Pirates fell to 0-2 overall.

The game was called in the fourth quarter with 11:43 remaining as inclement weather entered the area.

RECORD BOOKS SHATTERED: #5 ODU With 64-61 Victory Over #18/19 UNH Taylor Heinicke Throws for an NCAA Division I Record 730 yard

NORFOLK, Va. -- #5 Old Dominion University quarterback Taylor Heinicke threw for a Division I record 730 yards and five touchdowns as Jarod Brown kicked a 25-yard field goal with 41 seconds left and Andre Simmons intercepted a pass to clinch the 64-61 win over #18/19 New Hampshire Saturday afternoon.

Heinicke's 730 yards are an NCAA Division I record and just one yard shy of the all-division record set by Zamir Amin of Menlo (Div. III) who passed for 731 yards against Cal Lutheran in 2000. Heinicke's 730-yards passes the previous Division I record of 716 yards by David Kilinger of Houston in 1990 against Arizona State. The previous FCS high was 624 set by Weber State's Jamie Martin against Idaho State in 1991.

Passing yards weren't the only Division I record set by Heinicke either. The sophomore signal caller who also ran the ball 11 times for a team-leading 61 yards totaled 791 yards of total offense surpassing the FBS record of 732 by David Klingler of Houston against Arizona State in 1990 and the FCS record 668 by Robert Kent of Jackson State vs. Alabama in 2001.

ODU, which trailed by as many as 20 and was behind 40-24 at the break, scored three-straight touchdowns to start the fourth quarter. Two touchdowns from Nick Mayers and a two-yard run from Angus Harper gave ODU its first lead of the game, 61-54, with 4:39 left in the game.

Less than a minute later, the Wildcats knotted the game at 61-61 with Andy Vailas on a 45-yard pass to R.J. Harris.

On the Monarchs following drive, ODU traveled 74 yards in 11 plays to set up Brown's game-winning field goal.

Mayers collected a school record 271 yards receiving with a trio of touchdowns also tying the mark for catches in a game with 12. Antonio Vaughan also tied the school record with his 12 catches for 143 yards.

#4/4 ODU Footballs Runs to 45-37 Win Over Richmond Head into Bye Week Undefeated at 5-0

RICHMOND, Va. -- Old Dominion improved to 5-0 overall and 2-0 in CAA play with a 45-37 victory over the Richmond Spiders at Robins Stadium.

Seven different Monarchs got the nation's No. 1 scoring offense into the scoring mix as Old Dominion led by as many as 28 points entering the fourth quarter. Although the Spiders managed to score 20 points in the span of 3:21 in the fourth quarter to cut their deficit to eight, Old Dominion methodically wound down the clock over the game's final six minutes and 40 seconds for the win.

Old Dominion struck first covering 52 yards in four plays in a matter of 48 seconds on their second drive of the game. Junior running back Colby Goodwyn, one of three running backs to score for the Monarchs, lit up the scoreboard with a 27-yard touchdown run.

The Spiders tied the game on their ensuing possession. Richmond quarterback John Laub connected with Ben Edwards for a 39-yard touchdown with 9:14 left in the opening quarter.

However, just as the Monarchs have done all season, they struck back fast and furious going ahead 24-7 by the opening minutes of the second quarter.

Following the Richmond score, ODU ran 10 plays in under three minutes capped by signal caller Taylor Heinicke needing just five yards to cross into the end zone to give ODU the 14-7 lead.

The Monarch defense kept Richmond from moving past its own seven on the next drive. The Spiders were forced to punt giving ODU field position in Richmond territory resulting in a 26-yard field goal for Jarod Brown.

Nick Mayers put the Monarchs up 24-7 in the third play of second quarter. Mayers, tying his season-high in TD receptions at seven in just ODU's fifth game of the season, caught the seven-yard pass at the left corner of the goal line.

The Spiders put their second touchdown of the game up on the board at the 10 minute mark of the second half. Laub lobbed the ball over the Monarch defense to back of the end zone and into the hand of Kevin Finney.

However, the Monarchs weren't finished scoring and added a pair of touchdowns before the intermission.

A 46-yard reception by Larry Pinkard managed to get the Monarchs back onto the Richmond side of the field at the Spiders' own nine. Running back Tyree Lee helped ODU inch closer and closer to a score until Heinicke connected with Marquel Thomas on a short 1-yard pass. Sophomore running back Angus Harper later punched the ball in on a 12-play 80-yard drive with less than a minute left in the second quarter for the 38-14 advantage.

Alex Arain closed out the first half of action forcing a fumble resulting in an 11-yard sack.

The Spiders had a chance to cut into the deficit early in the third quarter, but a pair of Laub passes to Edwards and Stephen Barnette were incomplete in the end zone. Richmond would settle for the field goal with sophomore Remington Hinshaw putting a career-high 38 thru the uprights, but it still had his squad trailing the Monarchs 38-17 with nine minutes remaining in the third quarter.

Old Dominion responded immediately with another scoring drive to surpass last year's total of 42 against Richmond. Sophomore Tyree Lee got into the scoring mix with a trio of carries including a 14 yard rush to bring the Monarchs into the red zone and a seven-yard touchdown for a 45-17 edge with just over five minutes left in third quarter.

Richmond kept it interesting in outscoring the Monarchs 20-0 in the fourth quarter. The Spider's Doug Howell intercepted a Heinicke pass and returned it 22 yards for a score in the early moments of the final quarter. On their next possession, Richmond managed to move down field 94-yards in seven plays ending with a seven-yard touchdown run for Jovan Smith. The Spiders' extra point, however, was blocked by Chris Burnette, the Monarchs' second blocked PAT of the season.

It was four and out for the Monarchs next followed by Richmond needing only four plays to pull within single digits, 45-37. Edwards got in a 25-yard return to get the Spiders to mid-field and later tore down field 33 yards, setting up Laub to cross into the end zone.

Old Dominion took its time moving down field running out the final 6:40 left in the game.

Villanova Spoils Homecoming, 38-14
Wildcats Score 38 Unanswered Points and Keep
Monarchs Scoreless After the First Quarter

NORFOLK, Va. -- The Villanova Wildcats handed the #3/3 Football Monarchs their first loss of the 2012 campaign with a 38-14 win over ODU on its Homecoming.

The Monarchs, who had won nine of their last 10 games dating back to October 22nd of last season and were riding a six-game home win streak, fall to 5-1 on the year and 2-1 in Colonial Athletic Association action.

The Wildcats, winners of the 2009 FCS National Championship, improve to 5-2 overall and 3-1 in league action.

Old Dominion struck fast needing only four plays to get on the scoreboard and tying the school mark for fastest touchdown. The Monarchs' four-play, 88-yard opening drive took just 1:07 capped by a 17-yard reception by Nick Mayers.

The Football Monarchs took a 14-0 lead at just under the five minute mark on a 47-yard pass to Kirk Spellman for his first career touchdown.

The Monarchs went up 14-0 with just under five minutes remaining in the first quarter, but Villanova would go on to score 31 unanswered points behind three rushing touchdowns by quarterback John Robertson.

The Wildcats got onto the scoreboard on their next drive, right before the end of the opening quarter. Mark Hamilton connected on a 26-yard field goal after missing a 32-attempt midway through the first quarter.

Villanova started off the second quarter from its own seven, but found its way downfield with Robertson hitting Norman White for a 44-yard touchdown reception with 10 minutes remaining in the second quarter and Old Dominion leading 14-10 at the half.

Robertson found his way into the end zone in back-to-back drives to kick off the third quarter with 25 and 15 yard runs.

A Monarch fumble at the end of the third quarter set up another scoring drive for the Wildcats with Robertson punching in his third touchdown of the game to start the fourth quarter.

ODU's opening drive of the final stanza saw the Monarchs get down to the Wildcats' 18 at fourth and three, but quarterback Taylor Heinicke's pass was incomplete to Nick Mayers turning the ball back over Villanova.

Just like what the Monarchs did to Richmond two weeks ago, Villanova methodically wore down the clock and using nearly eight minutes to run 14-plays and go 82-yards for its final score of the contest on a 25-yard run by Kevin Monangai. Monangai finished the game with 188 yards on 26 carries.

Robertson finished the game with 151 yards passing and a game-high 189 yards rushing.

Monarch signal caller Taylor Heinicke threw for 239 yards completing 16 of his 32 passes with one interception.

The Football Monarchs return to action at Towson, last year's CAA Champion, on Saturday October 20th. Kick-off is set for 7:00 p.m.

TOWSON, Md. - Old Dominion University football raced out to a 10-0 lead and pushed its lead to as big as 31-6 en route to a 31-20 victory at Towson Saturday night.

With the win, the Monarchs improve to 6-1 overall and 3-1 in CAA play while the Tigers drop to 3-4 overall and 2-2 in conference play.

NORFOLK, Va. - Taylor Heinicke threw for 375 yards and ran for three touchdowns while Tyree Lee rushed for a career-high 128 yards and a touchdown as No. 6/7 Old Dominion University football defeated No. 20/16 Delaware 31-26 on a windy Saturday afternoon at Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

At the end of the first quarter the rain picked up but both teams were able to move the ball offensively, with ODU picking up 499 total yards while Delaware finished with 370.

After a Tyree Lee touchdown put ODU on top 28-17 midway through the third quarter, the Blue Hens pulled to within 28-26 on a Sean Baner 28-yard field goal and a Nihja White 13-yard TD pass. After White's touchdown, UD went for two but Hurley was sacked by Erik Saylor. ODU responded with a key 12-play 32-yard drive to lead to a 32-yard field goal from Jarod Brown to put the Monarchs on top 31-26 with just 1:17 to play.

The Monarchs answered with an 11 play 80-yard drive finished off with an 22-yard run by Heinicke to tie the score at seven.

Hurley and the Blue Hens retook the lead a minute into the second quarter with a 16-yard TD pass to Mike Milburn for a 14-7 UD lead.

ODU came back with a 13 play, 75-yard drive as Heinicke faked a handoff and ran around the left side for one yard for his second rushing score of the game and eighth in the last six games.

After an ODU interception, Delaware drove to the ODU eight before the drive stalled and Sean Baner connected on a 27-yard field goal for a 17-14 UD lead.

The Monarchs got the ball with 3:38 on the clock and promptly drove 78-yards in 11 plays capped off by another one-yard Heinicke run, his third rushing score of the day to give the Monarchs a 21-17 halftime lead.

Delaware got the ball out of the break and drove to the ODU 15 before a fumble on a bad snap knocked UD to the 30 and forced them to punt to force the Monarchs to start on their own 10.

On third and two at the 18 Lee busted off a 50-yard run to get ODU out of their own end and finished off the drive with a nine-yard score to give the Monarchs a 28-17 lead.

Heinicke was 36-for-45 in the air for 375 yards and ran for three scores while Nick Mayers caught 11 passes, one short of tying his career-high, for 131 yards while Blair Roberts had six catches for 52 yards and Larry Pinkard caught five for 75.

Heinicke was named the MVP of the Oyster Game.

Andrew Pierce ran for 72 yards on 12 carries while Julian Laing had 64 yards on 10 rushes.

Hurley was 12-of-20 for 134 yards and two touchdowns with Michael Johnson grabbing five catches for 36 yards.

Caleb Taylor led ODU with 12 tackles while Craig Wilkins had 10 tackles and 1.5 sacks.

The Monarchs are on the road next weekend to face Georgia State.

Devon Simmons clinched the game with an interception.

ODU scored 32-straight to open the game.

ATLANTA, Ga. - Old Dominion stormed out to a 32-0 halftime lead on the way to a 53-27 victory Saturday evening at the Georgia Dome.

ODU put up two touchdowns in the first quarter and two more in the second to go along with a Jarod Brown field goal to the half.

The Monarchs drove the opening kickoff down the field with ease, going 67 yards in nine plays capped by a Taylor Heinicke to Marquel Thomas nine-yard touchdown pass. Heinicke rolled to the right and found Thomas just across the goal line for the score. Nate Ong flipped a pass to Kai Blanco for the two-point conversion to put ODU on top 8-0.

After Alex Johnson forced and recovered a GSU fumble, Tyree Lee capped a 34 yard drive in just four plays on an 11-yard rush to give ODU a 15-0 lead.

ODU started the second quarter with a one-yard Angus Harper TD run, capping off a 69 yard drive in just five plays, as the drive was highlighted by a Heinicke to Larry Pinkard 34-yard pass play.

Pinkard increased ODU's lead to 29-0 at the five minute mark of the first half after Devon Simmons intercepted a Ben McLane pass at the GSU 29. Heinicke hit Pinkard from four-yards out with a lob pass over the defender.

The Monarchs ended the half with three more points as Craig Wilkins picked off a McLane pass at the 50 and returned it all the way to the GSU 16 to set up a Jarod Brown 28-yard field goal to give ODU its 32-0 halftime advantage.

Georgia State drove the opening kickoff of the second half 80 yards in 11 plays capped by a Rosevelt Watson score to get on the board but ODU responded with a Heinicke to Mayers score to increase the lead to 39-14.

Tyree Lee pushed ODU's lead to 46-14 but Albert Wilson returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards to make the score 46-21.

Angus Harper added a seven-yard TD run with two minutes to go for the final margin.

Heinicke was 28-of-42 in the air with three touchdowns while Marquel Thomas caught a career-high six passes for 72-yards and a TD while Larry Pinkard had six catches for 92-yards and a score.

Tyree Lee carried a career-high 25 times for 126 yards, just two yards shy of his career-high that he set just last week.

McLane was 13-of-32 for GSU for 226 yards and a TD.

John Darr had a team-best six tackles while Devon Simmons and Craig Wilkins recorded interceptions. Simmons' INT was his second-straight game with one and he is ODU's all-time leader with nine.

Old Dominion returns home next week to host William and Mary. The Monarchs will honor their 18 seniors in a pregame ceremony.

RECORD BOOK RUNDOWN

Here's how Old Dominion Sophomore Taylor Heinicke Tore Up the NCAA Record Books in #5/5 Old Dominion's 64-61 victory over #18/19 New Hampshire on September 22, 2012.

PASSING YARDS IN A QUARTER: Heinicke's 293-yard fourth quarter eclipsed the FCS record of 284 set by Western Illinois' Sam Clemons in the second quarter versus Indiana State in 2001.

PASSING YARDS IN A HALF: Heinicke's 480-yard second half dismantled the FCS record of 383 set by Marshall's Michael Payton in the first half against VMI in 1991. The Division I record is 517 by Houston's Andre Ware against SMU in 1989.

PASSING YARDS IN A GAME: As noted Saturday, Heinicke's 730 bests the Division I record of Houston's David Klingler, who threw for 716 against Arizona State in 1990, but just misses the all-division record of 736 by Sam Durley of Eureka College (DII) in a 62-55 comeback win over Knox College earlier this season. The FCS record was 624 by Weber State's Jamie Martin against Idaho State in 1991.

PASSES IN A GAME WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION: Heinicke's 79 breaks the all-division record of 77 set by Justin Peery of Division III Westminster of Missouri against MacMurray in 1998. The Division I record of 76 was shared by Eastern Michigan's Andy Schmitt (versus Temple in 2008) and Houston's Case Keenum (against UTEP in 2009).

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A QUARTER: Heinicke's 293 yards in the fourth, all through the air, breaks the FCS record of 278 set by Mississippi Valley State's Willie Totten in the second quarter against Kentucky State in 1984.

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A HALF: Heinicke had 496 after intermission (480 passing, 16 rushing), lapping the FCS record of 404 set by Stephen F. Austin's Todd Hammel in the first quarter against Louisiana-Monroe in 1989.

TOTAL OFFENSE IN A GAME: Also as noted Saturday, Heinicke's 791 yards (730 passing, 61 rushing) are an NCAA record, besting Klingler's 732 (716 passing, 16 rushing) versus Arizona State in 1990. The FCS record was 668 by Jackson State's Robert Kent (595 passing, 73 rushing) against Alabama State in 2001.

ABOUT ODU

Since restarting its football team in 2009, Old Dominion has compiled a four-year total of 31 wins and only eight losses. In the 2011 season, the Monarchs finished the year at 10-3 overall and ranked No. 10 in both The Sports Network/Fathead.com and FCS Coaches Final Polls.

On May 17th, Old Dominion announced it would elevate its football program to the FBS level joining Conference USA.

The Monarchs will play in the CAA in 2012 and while not eligible for the CAA Championship, the Monarchs are still eligible for the FCS playoffs via an at-large bid. ODU will be a transitional FCS team in 2013, a transitional FBS team in 2014, and a full Conference USA member in football in 2015 eligible for bowl game.
