CAA DOMINANCE: Old Dominion has captured 11-straight Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles since joining the league from the Sun Belt Conference during the 1991-92 season. The Lady Monarchs are 195-7 all-time in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). Old Dominion holds a 102-1 record at home and a 91-6-road record. The lone loss at the ODU Fieldhouse was against Richmond, now currently in the A-10, with a 70-74 loss on February 19, 1992. The Lady Monarchs have now won 140 of their last 141 in conference play. Five schools in the league have yet to beat Old Dominion – George Mason (29-0) and UNC-Wilmington (26-0) along with CAA newcomers Delaware (2-0), Drexel (2-0), Hofstra (2-0), and Towson (2-0).

2001-02 LADY MONARCH GAME DAY NOTES

WENDY WATCH: Lady Monarch head coach Wendy Larry reached her 350th as the head coach of her alma mater with a 90-57 victory at Hofstra on Feb. 22nd. She didn't wait long to reach another milestone in her career, posting her 400th career win just two days later in a 90-57 victory at Drexel, ironically the same score the Lady Monarch won by in Larry's 350th Old Dominion win. Larry has been a head coach for over 18 seasons, which have included stops at nearby Virginia Wesleyan, Arizona, and Old Dominion. She has become just the 33rd active women's basketball coach to have collect 400 or more victories.

GENERATION "X": The Lady Monarchs captured their 20th victory of the 2001-02 season on Feb. 22nd with a 90-57 win over Hofstra. It is the 11th straight season, dating back to the 1991-92 season, that ODU has amassed 20 or more wins in a season. In all, the Lady Monarchs have had 22 seasons with 20 or more wins.

FAREWELL TO THE FIELDHOUSE: With the Lady Monarchs being sent on the road for the NCAA Tournament, Old Dominion said good-bye to one of the most storied gyms in women's basketball history, the Old Dominion Fieldhouse, in the CAA Championship Game, a 76-48 victory over UNC-Wilmington for their 11th straight league title. The brand new state-of-the-art Ted Constant Convocation Center will become the new home to the ODU men's and women's basketball teams beginning in the 2002-03 season. The ODU Fieldhouse has been the site for countless memories including play by Nancy Liberman, Inge Nissen, Anne Donovan as well as WNBA players Ticha Penicheiro and Clarisse Machanguna. Powerhouse teams such as Tennessee, Connecticut, Stanford, Rutgers, North Carolina, and Louisiana Tech have all graced the floor of the Fieldhouse at one time or another. The Fieldhouse opened for the 1970-71 season and over the last 32 years, the women's basketball team has compiled a 703-226 record (.757), which includes all regular season, post-season, and exhibition games.

ALL-AMERICAN GIRL: She may be from France, but Lucienne Berthieu was named a District II Kodak All-American and advances to the nation ballot. CAA Player of the Year and come back kid senior Berthieu, is a three-time conference Player of the Year who missed all of last season due to an ACL injury. She currently leads the team with 13.5 points per game along with a 7.1 rebounding average. Additionally she ranks 12th in the nation in field goal percentage.

OKEISHA IS OKAY: Junior guard Okeisha Howard, who missed six games with a fractured right fibula in mid-January, is back to form. Howard, who up until her injury started all but one game for the Lady Monarchs, suffered her injury during a 71-51 Old Dominion victory at George Mason. Since returning to the court, ironically against the Patriots, Howard has been the powerful sparkplug off the bench. Although in her first outing the 5-5 guard was kept scoreless, she picked up two assists and a steal in 17 minutes of action. In just her third game back, Howard scored 12 points in 21 minutes in the Lady Monarchs victory over UNC-Wilmington. Since coming off the bench in the last 10 contests, Howard has averaged 9.0 points per game and 3.2 assists. She was named the CAA Tournament Most Valuable Player with clutch play in overtime against George Mason in the CAA semi-final and averaged 12.3 points in tournament contests.

TAKE ME TO YOUR LEADER: Did you know that the Lady Monarchs did not trail in a game for nearly five games. George Mason took a brief 20 second lead, 4-5, before ODU took control of the game on Feb. 8th and the Lady Monarchs did not relinquish that lead until Feb. 24th when Drexel hit the first shot to go up 2-0.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT: The Lady Monarchs needed overtime to put away the George Mason Patriots on their quest for their 11th consecutive CAA title, 68-63. The Patriots were not only the first CAA team all season long to have a lead over the Lady Monarchs in the second half, but also were the only CAA team to rebound Old Dominion as well, 44-39. The Lady Monarchs however were finally able to shake off the Patriots using a 12-7 overtime surge to capture the victory.

EXTRA SESSIONS: The CAA semi-final overtime game against George Mason marked just the 10th overtime game in Lady Monarch basketball history and just the second time that the Lady Monarchs have had to play in more than one extra session game in a season. The Lady Monarchs used a 69-65 overtime victory over Purdue in the second round the NCAA Tournament in 1997 and just two games later used a 83-82 extra stanza win to propel themselves in the NCAA Championship game against Tennessee over top ranked Stanford. Earlier this season, back on December 6th, Old Dominion needed some extra time to put away the then 21st ranked Penn State Lady Lions for their first Top 25 win in nearly three years, 84-80. Four overtime games have occurred at the Fieldhouse -- this year's Penn State and George Mason games, last year's loss to Syracuse, 84-85, and a 69-65 win over Purdue in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1997. In fact, three of the nine overtime games that Lady Monarchs have been played in have been in NCAA Tournament action.

1,000th POINT SCORERS: This year's version of the Lady Monarchs boast four 1,000 career point scorers, three of which reached the historic mark this season. Senior Hamchetou Maiga poured in her 1,000th career point last season and has collected more points over the last four years than any one else on the roster. Lucienne Berthieu reached her 1,000th career point in the December 29th game at the Fieldhouse against the top ranked UConn Huskies. Sharron Francis netted hers against James Madison on Feb. 17th and Okeisha Howard reached the mark at Drexel on Feb. 24th. In all, 22 Lady Monarchs have reached 1,000 points or more.

IT'S THE DUKES, IT'S THE DUKES: Senior Lucienne Berthieu really likes to play James Madison. Berthieu poured in 32 points for a new-career high on Jan. 27th in a 68-51 victory over second place league rival James Madison. Berthieu's 30+ point outing was the most by a Lady Monarch since she netted 31 against Memphis, her previous career-high, back in December of 1999. The second time around, Berthieu didn't score as many points, but was a perfect 10-of-10 from the field in a 67-43 victory on Feb. 17th. She finished the game with a game-high 20 points.

D-D-D-DEFENSE: The Lady Monarchs allowed Towson to net just 26 points in the season opening victory over the Tigers. It was the lowest point total by an opponent since a 83-32 victory over UNC-Wilmington (2/15) and a 78-32 win over William and Mary (2/22) last year. The Tigers netted just 10 points in the first half. In the rematch on Feb. 3rd, the Lady Monarchs allowed the Tigers just seven points at the half and 27 points total. The lowest opponent point total in Lady Monarch history was 10 by Christopher Newport back in the 1971-72 season.

MAIGA'S DOUBLES: Senior Hamchetou Maiga collected nine double-doubles this season, more than any of her teammates. Her ninth double scoring and rebounding performance came in the CAA semi-final victory over George Mason with 11 points and 10 boards. Six of Maiga's nine double-doubles have come at the Fieldhouse (Drexel, Penn State, Seton Hall, UNC-W, William and Mary, and George Mason) and three double digit scoring and rebounding efforts coming on the road (Towson, Rutgers and UNC-Wilmington).

IF YOU CAN'T SCORE, YOU CAN'T WIN: The Rutgers Scarlet Knights are known for their defense on the floor, but it was the Lady Monarchs' defense which shone against the Scarlet Knights on Feb. 1st. Old Dominion held Rutgers scoreless in the final 9:05 of the first half and proceeded to hold the Scarlet Knights from scoring a field goal for 3:53 into the second stanza. That was a total of 12:58 in which the Lady Monarchs denied the Scarlet Knights from hitting a shot from the field.

DENIED: The Lady Monarchs registered a new season high of 13 blocks against George Mason back on Feb. 8th. Junior Kim Giddens and seniors Lucienne Berthieu and Tiffany Thompson each swatted away three shots. Berthieu tied her career-high while Thompson recorded a new season high. The previous team season-high was 12 blocks against UNC-Wilmington on Jan. 24th, with 10 of the rejections occurring during the first half of play. Both Kim Giddens and Hamchetou Maiga tied their career-highs with four blocks on the night. Giddens other four block effort came against Tennessee last year at the Fieldhouse while Maiga's was against former CAA rival East Carolina last season.

GIDDENS TAMES DRAGONS, SINKS SEAHAWKS: In one of her most impressive outings of the season, junior Kim Giddens poured in 10 points and six rebounds in the Lady Monarchs' 74-52 victory over CAA newcomer Drexel on Jan. 20th and then followed with a team-high 14 points against UNC-Wilmington on Jan. 24th in a 63-39 win. Giddens was 4-of-7 from the floor and 2-of-2 from the line and was one of four Lady Monarchs in double figures in only 13 minutes on the court against the Dragons. Versus the Seahawks, Giddens scored her season-high 14 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the field and sinking 2-of-3 from the line in just 14 minutes of action. She also tied her career high swatting away four shots on net.

GRANT GETS THE NOD: Rookie Shareese Grant was inserted into the Lady Monarch line-up for the first time in her career against Hofstra on Jan. 17th due to the injury to junior Okeisha Howard. Grant finished the night nearly missing a double-double with nine points and nine rebounds. Grant started three games this season in place of the injured Okeisha Howard, but returned to becoming a spark off the bench in favor of a bigger line-up. When a member of the starting five, Grant averaged 7.7 points and 7.7 rebounds.

MORE WITH MONIQUE: Just before the highly anticipated conference game with James Madison on Jan. 27th, head coach Wendy Larry had a vision of a bigger line-up which included Monique Coker. Well, Coker started the game and proceeded to be a member of the starting five in the last 12 of 13 contests. Following Coach Larry's vision, Coker poured in a then season-high 17 points. As a member of the starting unit, Coker is averaging 10.1 points and 5.6 boards and has registered 15 points, 10 rebound effort against Delaware and a season-high 20 points over Hofstra in front of family and friends from her hometown area of the Bronx, NY.

FRANCIS GETS THE POINT: With the injury to Okeisha Howard, senior Sharron Francis saw more significant time at the point position. In her first outing since Howard's injury against Hofstra on Jan. 17, Francis was one of five Lady Monarchs in double figures with 14 points. She also handed out five assists. With Howard out, Francis averaged 11.5 points and 6.3 assists. During that span she also poured in a season-high 15 points in the final non-conference game of the year, a 70-48 victory over Rutgers.

BLUE HEN BULLY: With an 82-55 victory over CAA newcomer Delaware on Jan. 11th, the Lady Monarchs gave the Blue Hens their first back-to-back losses since the 1999-2000 season. Old Dominion also snapped Delaware's 22 home-game winning streak, which at the time was the third largest in the country.

THANK YOU FANS: The Connecticut game on Dec. 29th brought 5,236 fans to the Fieldhouse marking the largest crowd to witness a Lady Monarch game in the building's 32 years. The crowd eclipsed the previous high by 25 fans with 5,211 in attendance at senior day against William and Mary back in 1998.

MORE ATTANDANCE RECORDS FALL: The Lady Monarchs set their first attendance mark at the Fieldhouse with 5,236 spectators witnessing Old Dominion's game against the top ranked Connecticut Huskies back on Dec. 29th. However, Old Dominion helped set another attendance mark, this time on the road at Delaware. 2,642 people entered the Bob Carpenter Arena on Jan. 11th, marking the largest crowd on hand for a Blue Hen women's basketball in history.

100 POINT CLUB: The Lady Monarchs produced two consecutive 100-point outings to open up 2002. The 108 points scored against Virginia Commonwealth on Jan. 4th marked the largest output by Old Dominion this season, surpassing the previous high of 105 points scored against William and Mary the game before. It was the first time they broke the century mark since the 108-67 win over Richmond in 1999-00. The last time the Lady Monarchs strung together back-to-back 100 point games was back in the 1996-97 season, the same season they reached the championship game of the NCAA Tournament. Old Dominion used a 102-46 win over George Mason to close out the 96-97 regular season and put together a 101-35 victory to open up the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Tournament. Those two games were the second back-to-back 100 point games for the Lady Monarchs in 1996-97. They also produced a 104-49 win over American and a 107-62 victory over George Mason in the middle of the season.

EVERYBODY SCORES: The Jan. 4th game against Virginia Commonwealth marked the second time this season everyone on the active Lady Monarch roster scored. The Old Dominion bench scored 64 of the 108 points (59 percent), including season and career highs for rookie Shareese Grant (22 points) and sophomore Marianthi Koukouvinou (8 points). Both Senior Sharlenia Charles (4 points) and junior Kim Giddens (8 points) tied their then season highs. All Lady Monarch personnel scored against Denver on Dec. 20th as well.

DISHING IT OUT: The Lady Monarchs recorded a season-high 30 assists as a team against Virginia Commonwealth on Jan. 4th, the most since they recorded 30 against East Carolina on Feb. 4, 2001. Senior Hamchetou Maiga reset her career high with nine assists. Her previous high was seven, set against the Towson Tigers in the 2001-02 season opener. Junior Okeisha Howard also managed to record a new season-high in dishes with six against the Rams. Her previous high was five, recorded against both Penn State and Denver.

LADY VOLS ON THE SCHEDULE: Did you know that the Lady Volunteers have appeared on the Lady Monarchs schedule every year since the 1976-77 season? Tennessee is the biggest non-conference rivals in Old Dominion history with the two teams having faced each other 35 times over the course of the last 25 years.

HOLDING THE HUSKIES: The 14-point margin of victory tied a season-low for Connecticut on Dec. 29th. The Lady Monarchs gave the top ranked Huskies a run for their money in the 70-84 loss. The Huskies, who had been averaging a 37.8 margin of victory entering the game, lost by just 14 points. The Huskies also allowed a 14-point victory, 86-72, against both Oklahoma and Tennessee.

DECEMBER REVIEW: Old Dominion went 3-2 in the month of December. Note that both losses came at the hands of Top 25 teams. The Lady Monarchs lost to then 24th-ranked North Carolina (85-95) to open the month of December, but rallied to win their next three consecutive games. Among the three straight victories was a thrilling 84-80 overtime victory against then 22nd ranked Penn State. Old Dominion closed the final month of 2001 with a 70-84 loss to #1 Connecticut.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH: In front of family and friends who traveled from New Mexico, sophomore Myriah Spence had her breakout performance of the year, netting a team and season-high 18 points in Old Dominion's 91-69 victory over Denver on Dec. 20th. The second year guard came off the bench to shoot 7-of-12 from the field, including 4-of-6 from downtown.

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE: Senior Hamchetou Maiga received her undergraduate degree in Information Systems at Old Dominion's graduation ceremony held on December 16th. Maiga was granted her fourth year of eligibility after completing her degree requirements this past summer. She is currently working towards her M.B.A.

2001-02 LADY MONARCH GAME DAY NOTES

HERE'S COMES THE TOP 25: Jan. 9th's game against Tennessee marked the fifth Top 25 team and third Top 10 opponent (based on rank at the time of play) for the Lady Monarchs this season. Earlier this year, Old Dominion faced three consecutive Top 25 foes, going 1-2 in that span. On December 6th Old Dominion defeated #21/22 Penn State for their first victory over a ranked opponent since upsetting 4th ranked Connecticut at the Fieldhouse in 1999. The last time Old Dominion faced three consecutive Top 25 opponents during the regular season was back in early 1987. The Lady Monarchs, who dropped all three matches to their ranked opponents, faced three consecutive Top 10 opponents losing to #1/3 Tennessee, 52-83, at the Hall of Fame Tournament, #10/7 Virginia on the road, 55-57, and #9/8 Maryland at the Fieldhouse (75-90).

BIG EAST, BIG FOES: The BIG EAST Conference appeared more times on this year's Lady Monarch non-conference schedule than any other conference. Old Dominion has faced Virginia Tech, Seton Hall, Connecticut, and Rutgers. Last year, the BIG EAST conference sent five teams to the NCAA Tournament: Villanova, Virginia Tech, Rutgers, final four participant Connecticut, and national champion Notre Dame.

A POINT GUARD AT HEART: Senior Tiffany Thompson may be listed as a forward/center, but opponents better watch out for her deadly range. Thompson hit at least one shot from downtown between ODU's 74-58 setback to N.C. State back on November 26th and the narrow upset of Tennessee on Jan. 8th. Twice this season she has had perfect performances from beyond the arc -- against VCU (2-of-2) and UConn (3-of-3). Thompson scored nine of her season-high 11 points against the Pirates on Dec. 14th from downtown. On the season, Thompson has shot 44 percent from behind the arc, making her the best three-point shooter on the team.

THE REBOUNDS IMPROVE: At one point during the season, head coach Wendy Larry left a note in the locker room telling her team that it was the worst rebounding team she has ever coached. Well the Lady Monarchs certainly got the message as Old Dominion outrebounded Penn State 52-31 on Dec. 6th. In fact, Lucienne Berthieu grabbed a career high 19 boards against the Lady Lions, the most by a Lady Monarch in a game since fellow teammate Hamchetou Maiga grabbed 20 against Southern Methodist in the NCAA Tournament on March 20th, 2000. Old Dominion also outrebounded the Huskies 48-42 on Dec. 29th, the first and only team to do so all year against the nation's top ranked team. The Lady Monarchs followed up with a season-high 62 rebounds against the William and Mary Tribe on New Year's Day. ODU finished the game outrebounding the Tribe by 34 boards. Just three teams overall have managed to outrebound the Lady Monarchs this season.

RETIREMENT: Redshirt freshman Shareese Grant had her jersey retired at nearby Princess Anne High School in Virginia Beach in December. Wearing #24, Grant was a Three-time All-Tidewater Player of the Year, all-district, all-region, and all-state team selection averaging 26.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. Grant became just the second women's basketball player to have her jersey retired at Princess Anne. Fellow teammate, Okeisha Howard was the first.

MONARCH MILEAGE: The Lady Monarchs' outing to Denver was their lone trip on an airplane during the regular season. Old Dominion used a bus for their remaining away games. Not to fear as the Lady Monarchs use a sleeper bus which can accommodate all student-athletes, coaches, and staff that travel with the team.

FROM THE LINE: Old Dominion's woes from the free throw line continue to get better. The Lady Monarchs entered the month of December shooting just 55 percent from the line. Against the Tar Heels on Dec. 2, Old Dominion shot a season-high 80 percent from the charity stripe, which included perfect performances by Okeisha Howard (5-of-5), Sharron Francis (2-of-2), and Kim Giddens (2-of-2). Lucienne Berthieu, who up until that point was shooting just 52 percent from the line, connected on 8-of-11. Entering Dec. 14th's game against Seton Hall, senior Hamchetou Magia was averaging just 33.3 percent from the charity stripe. In perhaps her best performance from the line this season, "Tanty" sank seven of her 11 attempts, accounting for half of her points scored that evening. Okeisha Howard also continued as the team's best free three shoots, sinking all six of her attempts versus the Pirates. Against Denver, the free throws continued to sink as the team hit 77 percent from the line. Berthieu and sophomore Monique Coker, whom both struggled at the beginning of the year from the charity stripe, hit 5-of-6 and 6-of-6 respectively. As a team, the Lady Monarchs are hitting 65 percent from the line, up ten percent from the beginning of December.

2-3 WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE: Although the Lady Monarchs began the year 2-3, you couldn't count this team out. Last year Old Dominion began the season 2-3, captured their 10th straight CAA title and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The 1993-94 version of the Lady Monarchs also began their season 2-3 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament losing to eventual national champion North Carolina. The 1986-87 team also began their season 2-3, but eventually ranked as high as #12 in the AP Poll. That same season, the Lady Monarchs received a first round bye in the NCAA Tournament, upset fourth seeded North Carolina and advanced to the Sweet 16. Don't forget that the 1992-93 squad opened the year 0-4 before compiling a 22-8 record, a CAA Championships, and a second round appearance in the NCAA, bowing out to Final Four participant, Iowa.

LOOK OUT FOR LU: Pre-Season CAA Player of the Year Lucienne Berthieu saw improvement with each of the Lady Monarch's first three games this season after sitting out the 2000-01 season with a torn ACL. In the season opener against Towson, Berthieu attempted just one shot and recorded three points from the charity stripe. In the following game against Virginia Tech, Berthieu was 3-of-9 from the floor and added three points from the free throw line for nine total. She also added in eight boards. Against VCU, she added in her first double-double performance of the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds. Her shooting improved as well as she hit 3-of-4 from the field and 5-of-7 from the line. Against the 24th ranked Tar Heels, she landed a new season-high with 16 points and against the #21/22 Lady Lions, Berthieu tied her season-high with 16 points and reset her career-high with 19 boards.

ODU'S SPARKPLUG: Junior guard Okeisha Howard came off the Lady Monarch bench to light it up for 20 points in 15 minutes in the win over CAA rival Virginia Commonwealth (70-51). Howard sat out the first half due, but ignited the team with fresh legs and 8-of-11 shooting from the floor. Holding just a four-point edge at halftime (29-25), Old Dominion outscored the Rams 41-26. Howard accounted for nearly 50 percent of the Lady Monarch offense in the second stanza.

FAMILY AFFAIR: Cousins Old Dominion senior guard Sharron Francis and Virginia Commonwealth senior guard Rochelle Luckett spent some quality time together right after Thanksgiving. Francis helped her Lady Monarch team to a 70-51 CAA conference win, while pre-season All-CAA team member Luckett added nine points, six rebounds, and six assists in the Rams defeat. The two relatives faced each other again on Jan. 4th. Francis scored 10 points, dished out four assists, and registered three steals while her cousin Luckett was held to just six points by the Lady Monarch defense. She did however equal her Lady Monarch cousin with four assists.

OPENING THE SEASON: The Lady Monarchs have compiled a 25-8 record in season openers. Under Wendy Larry, the Lady Monarchs hold an 12-3 record in season opening games. The 82 points netted by Old Dominion was the largest opening point total by the team since they started the 1999-2000 season with a 91-64 victory over Hampton Roads rival, Hampton. The largest season opening total by the Lady Monarch was against Virginia Union with a 122-62 win.

CONFERENCE OPENER: The Lady Monarchs wasted no time in starting the conference season. The opening regular season game against Towson, also marked the first game in CAA play. It marked the first time in school history that Old Dominion has opened the season with a league game. Although the Lady Monarchs opened against Virginia Commonwealth in 1991 (W, 77-67) and 1992 (L, 67-72), the Rams did not join the CAA until the 1995-96 season. TEN FINGERS, TEN RINGS: Prior to tip-off of the 2001-02 season opener vs. Towson, the Lady Monarchs received their CAA Championship rings. The Lady Monarch have won an NCAA record 10 straight championship titles since joining the CAA during the 1991-92 season.

GLOBAL SPECTRUM: Old Dominion University has selected the Philadelphia-based firm Global Spectrum to manage the Constant Convocation Center, which is slated to open in late fall 2002. The highly regarded company provides management for public assembly

facilities across the country, most notably the First Union Center, which is home to the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers, as well as facilities at Temple University and the universities of South Carolina, Rhode Island and New Hampshire. Global Spectrum will be involved with all pre-opening phases of managing the facility. This includes working and consulting on facility design, preparing marketing programs, brochures and other literature on the facility, preparing a pre-opening budget, recruiting, hiring and training a general manager and facility staff, supervising the procurement of furniture, fixtures and equipment, booking and marketing the facility, securing subcontractors, and analyzing all operational details. Global Spectrum will also establish and implement financial and accounting programs and procedures, as well as prepare the facility for its opening.
