COACHES SHOW: The Wendy Larry Show on ESPN Radio (1310 am) will be broadcast on Monday's from 5:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. Join host Tony Mercurio along with Old Dominion Lady Monarch head coach Wendy Larry in reviewing the previous weeks games and get an insight on upcoming Lady Monarch battles. TV TIME: The Lady Monarchs' match-up with Connecticut (12/29) and James Madison (2/17) will appear on Comcast SportsNet in the Baltimore-Washington area which reaches over three million households. The CAA Tournament championship game will also air on the same network on March 9th.

HERE'S COMES THE TOP 25: Tonight's game will mark the second game against a Top 25 opponent for the Lady Monarch this season. In their last outing, Old Dominion took on #9/8 North Carolina State. The last time the Lady Monarchs faced back-to-back Top 25 foes was at the end of January last season. The Lady Monarchs dropped home contests against #3 Tennessee (70-87) and #14 Rutgers (45-69), both of whom appear on this year's schedule as well. On the Old Dominion slate, all but one non-conference opponent (Seton Hall) is either ranked or has received votes in the current AP and USA TODAY/ESPN Poll. On the Tar Heel side, North Carolina has already faced #1 Connecticut, their lone loss to date.

THAT 70'S SHOW: Today's game will honor the Lady Monarchs of the 70's as Old Dominion nears closer to their last game at the Fieldhouse. During the 1970's the Lady Monarchs compiled a 147-67 overall mark and captured the AIAW National Championship in 1979 and the Women's NIT Championship in 1978. At halftime, alumni of the Old Dominion women's basketball team will be honored. Among the many to be in attendance are former head coach and current assistant coach of the WNBA's Washington Mystics Marianne Stanley (1977-1987) and former Lady Monarch standout and current head coach of the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs, Maura McHugh (1971-1975).

NHASSENKO UPDATE: Junior college transfer Evelina “Max” Nhassengo will not suit up against the Tar Heels tonight. Nhassengo injured her left knee during practice on November 15th following a collision. She underwent a MRI last Friday afternoon which determined injury to her media collateral ligament (MCL) and posterior cruciate ligament (PCL). No timetable for Nhassengo's return has been set.

INTRA-STATE RIVALS: Old Dominion holds a 281-58 record against fellow Virginia schools. Head Coach Wendy Larry has compiled a 133-18 against intra-state rivals. Since becoming a varsity sport in 1969, Old Dominion has had 13 undefeated season against Virginia schools. Five schools from the state of Virginia grace this year's schedule (Virginia Tech, Virginia Commonwealth, George Mason, James Madison, and William and Mary). To date, the Lady Monarch hold a 1-1 record, with the last game being a 70-51 victory over Virginia Commonwealth. Last season, the Lady Monarchs posted a 12-3 record against schools from the Commonwealth.

SU "SPENCE" FUL: Junior guard Alli Spence had a breakout game against Virginia Commonwealth last Friday night. Spence logged her first start of the season and came away with 13 points after being held scoreless in the team's first two outings of the year. She was 5-of-10 from the field, including 3-of-7 from downtown, to end the game as the Lady Monarch's second leading scorer. Additionally she tied her career high for field goals attempted (10) and three point field goals attempted (7).

LOOK OUT FOR LU: Pre-Season CAA Player of the Year Lucienne Berthieu has seen improvement with each of the Lady Monarch's three games this season after sitting out the 2000-01 season with a torn ACL. In the season opener against Towson, Berthieu attempted just one shot and recorded three points from the charity stripe. In the next game against Virginia Tech, Berthieu was 3-of-9 from the floor and added three points from the free throw line for nine total. She also added in eight boards. Last Friday against VCU, she added in her first double-double performance of the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds. Her shooting improved as well as she hit 3-of-4 from the field and 5-of-7 from the line.

ODU'S SPARKPLUG: Junior guard Okeisha Howard came off the Lady Monarch bench to light it up for 20n points in 15 minutes in Friday's victory over CAA rival Virginia Commonwealth (70-51). Howard sat out the first half due, but ignited the team with fresh legs and 8-of-11 shooting from the floor. Holding just a four point edge at halftime (29-25), Old Dominion outscored the Rams 41-26. Howard accounted for nearly 50 percent of the Lady Monarch offense in the second stanza.

FAMILY AFFAIR: Cousins Old Dominion senior guard Sharron Francis and Virginia Commonwealth senior guard Rochelle Luckett spent some quality time together on Friday night. Francis helped her Lady Monarch team to a 70-51 CAA conference win, while pre-season All-CAA team member Luckett added nine points, six rebounds, and six assists in the Rams defeat. The two relatives face each other at least on more time this season as VCU travels to Norfolk on Jan. 4.

OPENING THE SEASON: The Lady Monarchs have compiled a 25-8 record in season openers. Under Wendy Larry, the Lady Monarchs hold an 12-3 record in season opening games. The 82 points netted by Old Dominion was the largest opening point total by the team since they started the 1999-2000 season with a 91-64 victory over Hampton Roads rival, Hampton. The largest season opening total by the Lady Monarch was against Virginia Union with a 122-62 win.

CONFERENCE OPENER: The Lady Monarchs wasted no time in starting the conference season. The opening regular season game against Towson, also marked the first game in CAA play. It marked the first time in school history that Old Dominion has opened the season with a league game. Although the Lady Monarchs opened against Virginia Commonwealth in 1991 (W, 77-67) and 1992 (L, 67-72), the Rams did not join the CAA until the 1995-96 season. The Lady Monarchs are 11-0 in Colonial Athletic Association Conference openers.

D-D-D-DEFENSE: The Lady Monarchs allowed Towson to net just 29 points in the season opening victory over the Tigers. It was the lowest point total by an opponent since a 83-32 victory over UNC-Wilmington (2/15) and a 78-32 win over William and Mary (2/22) last year. The Tigers netted just 10 points in the first half establishing new Lady Monarch record for fewest points scored in a half by an opponent. The previous record was 11 at James Madison on December 13, 1972.

TIGER TUMBLE: Old Dominion held the Towson Tigers to just 29 points in the 2001-02 season opener. It marked the lowest output by a Tiger team in the school's history. The previous record was 34 , recorded in a 83-34 loss to Vermont last year.

MAIGA ON THE ASSIST: Old Dominion senior Hamchetou Maiga tied her career high with seven assists against Towson. Maiga also dished out the ball seven times during last year's NCAA run in the tournament's first round against Washington. It also marks the most assist my Maiga in CAA play.

REJECTED: Myriah Spence tied her career high blocking total with two rejections against Towson in the 2001-02 season opener against Towson. Spence also swatted away two opponent shots last season against George Mason on February 25th.

TEN FINGERS, TEN RINGS: Prior to tip-off of the 2001-02 season opener vs. Towson, the Lady Monarchs received their CAA Championship rings. The Lady Monarch have won an NCAA record 10 straight championship titles since joining the CAA during the 1991-92 season.

FAREWELL TO THE FIELDHOUSE: 11 more games (excluding CAA Tournament action) will be playing in the confines of the Fieldhouse before moving over to the new, state-of-the-art, Constant Convocation Center. Throughout the year, Old Dominion will be celebrating the three decades of Lady Monarch history and tradition on the hardwood:

WE'RE PICKED NUMBER ONE: Old Dominion was the unanimous choice of the media to win the 2001-02 CAA women's basketball championship in a vote taken Wednesday at CAA basketball media day at the ESPNZone in Baltimore. ODU senior forward Lucienne Berthieu, who missed all of last season with a knee injury after earning CAA Player of the Year honors in 1999 and 2000, was selected as CAA Preseason Player of the Year for 2002. Joining her on the preseason All-CAA squad were teammates Hamchetou Maiga, the 2001 CAA Player of the Year and Okeisha Howard, James Madison junior forward Nadine Morgan and Virginia Commonwealth senior guard Rochelle Luckett.

This list is an independent duplication of the RPI without input from the NCAA, which does not release the RPI to the public. It is derived from three component factors: Div. I winning percentage (FI, 25%), schedule strength (FII, 50%); and opponent's schedule strength (FIII, 25%).

2001 CAA Tournament MVP Monique Coker narrowly missed a double-double performance with a 14-point, nine rebound effort in the Lady Monarchs' annual Blue and White Game held at the Old Dominion Fieldhouse. Senior Sharron Francis netted 13 points and added four-steals for the White Team in the Lady Monarchs 2001-02 season debut.

The afternoon marked the return of senior Lucienne Berthieu, a two-time CAA Player of the Year and 2001 CAA Pre-Season Player of the Year. Berthieu, taking to the court in the Lady Monarch uniform for the first time since the end of the 2000 season, totaled 11 points on 4-for-6 shooting in 20 minutes of action for the White Team. The White Team also boasted newcomer Evelina "Max" Nhassego who last year was the Junior College Player of the Year. Nhassego had an impressive debut, needing just one more rebound for a double-double afternoon. The 5-10 junior guard from Central Florida Community College scored 12 points and collected nine boards. Sophomore guard Myriah Spence registered a game-high five steals, while fellow classmate Alli Spence chipped in a team-high five assists.

For the Blue Team, red-shirt freshman Shareese Grant made her Old Dominion debut. The Virginia Beach native collected eight points and three rebounds. Junior guard Okiesha Howard also registered double digits with 11 points, four steals, and a game-high seven assists.

Old Dominion University senior Hamchetou Maiga scored a game high 22 points to lead the 18th ranked Lady Monarchs to a 89-68 exhibition win over Remus Powerbasket (from Austria). Five Lady Monarchs were in double figures.

With the score tied at 24 with 9:13 left in the first half, sophomore Monique Coker hit a layup to put the Lady Monarchs up for good. Old Dominion proceeded to outscore their international visitors 21-15 the rest of the way for a 45-39 halftime lead.

In the second half Maiga scored 12 points as the Lady Monarchs pulled away, leading by as much as 22, 73-51 with 8:16 left in the game. Lucienne Berthieu scored ten points and hauled in ten rebounds, while junior Max Nhassego scored 14 points, Kim Giddens 12 and Okiesha Howard ten points. Howard also came up with five steals.

Remus Powerbasket was led by Samantha Woosnam and Simona Jurse, each with 20 points. Woosnam hauled in nine rebounds. Remus committed 25 turnovers and shot .472 from the floor. Old Dominion dominated the boards, hauling in 49 rebounds and shooting .494 from the floor.

The Old Dominion women's basketball team dismantled MI Express, 90-38, in their final preseason tuneup. Every Old Dominion player walked away with points, including three Lady Monarchs in double figures led by junior guard [Okeisha Howard](#) with 11.

Old Dominion allowed M.I. Express to net just 12 points in the first half of play, while going on to score 44. The Lady Monarchs held M.I. Express scoreless through the first six minutes of play taking a 15-0 run to open the game. M.I. Express' 38 points was the fewest points allow by an Old Dominion opponent since a 83-32 victory over UNC-Wilmington (2/15) and a 78-32 win over William and Mary (2/22) last year.

In the opening half, M.I. Express shot just 4-for-31 (.129), while Old Dominion connected on 18 of its 37 shots to shoot 48.6 percent from the floor. The Lady Monarchs finished the game shooting at a 44.7 percent mark, while holding their opponent to just 20.3 percent shooting.

Other notable performances from the Lady Monarchs include a 10 point, six rebound effort from [Hamchetou Maiga](#) and 10 points from redshirt freshman [Shareese Grant](#). For the visitors, M.I. Express was led by Rea Anna Mulholland with 15 points.
