ABOUT VIRGINIA COMMONWEALTH: The Rams turned in an impressive performance at 10th – ranked Georgia on Sunday before suffering an 83-70 setback to James Madison. Virginia Commonwealth led the unbeaten Bulldogs 35-25 late in the first half and owned a 38-35 advantage at the break. Sophomore guard Cyndy Wilks scored 15 points for the Rams in her first career start, hitting 4-of-9 from three-point range. She also set career highs with four assists and four steals. Wilks has 38 points in VCU's last two games after averaging 4.2 ppg over the team's first nine contests. Junior forward Kristine Austgulen added 15 points and five rebounds at Georgia. VCU drained nine three-pointers against Georgia and is shooting a sizzling 49.1 percent (28-of-57) from beyond the arc over its last three games. The Rams will look to even up the season series tonight after the Lady Monarchs handed VCU a 70-51 post-Thanksgiving loss back on November 23 at the Siegel Center. Austgulen led all scorers that evening scoring 21 points in 39 minutes of action.

100 POINT CLUB: The 105 points scored against the Tribe on Tuesday were the most points for the Lady Monarchs since they scored 110 against the Tribe in 1997-98 and is the first time they broke the century mark since the 108-67 win over Richmond in 1999-00.

SATELLITE VIEWERS: Tuesday's game against Tennessee will be broadcast by Comcast Southeast out of Atlanta which will reach over three million homes. Although the telecast will not reach the Hampton Roads area, those with a satellite dish will be able to watch all the action as the Lady Monarchs take on the second ranked Lady Vols. Coordinates to view the game are galaxy1119.

SPENCE UPDATE: Junior guard Alli Spence has taken a medical leave of absence from the Lady Monarch women's basketball team as of December 14th. Spence, who is averaging 3.0 points, 1.3 rebounds, and 2.5 assists per game, is currently listed as day-to-day. No timetable has been set for her return. Spence however did travel back home to Colorado for Winter Break with the team as they flew out west to play the University of Denver.

THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS: Assistant coach Stacy Himes returns to the Lady Monarch bench for tonight's game with the Rams. Himes' mother, who had a long on-going battle with Encephalitis, passed away on December 26th.

DOUBLING FRANCIS: Senior Sharron Francis recorded her first double-double of the season with a season-high 14 points and career-high 10 assists. Her previous career-high was eight assists against three different teams through her three + years as a Lady Monarch.

THANK YOU FANS: Saturday's Connecticut game brought 5,236 fans to the Fieldhouse marking the largest crowd to witness a Lady Monarch game in the building's 32 years. The crowd eclipsed the previous high by 25 fans with 5,211 in attendance at senior day against William and Mary back in 1998.

HOLDING THE HUSKIES: The 14-point margin of victory tied a season-low for Connecticut on Saturday. The Lady Monarchs gave the top ranked Huskies a run for their money in the 70-84 loss on Saturday. The Huskies, who had been averaging a 37.8 margin of victory entering the game, lost by just 14 points. The Huskies also allowed a 14-point victory over Oklahoma, 86-72, right before the Christmas holiday.

BERTHIEU REACHES CENTURY MARK: Senior Lucienne Berthieu became the 20th Lady Monarch to reach 1,000 career points in Old Dominion's loss to Connecticut on Saturday. Berthieu reached the milestone with a lay-up at the 5:15 mark in the second half. Needing just 15 points entering the contest to reach the century club, Berthieu finished the game with 17 points.

DECEMBER REVIEW: Old Dominion went 3-2 in the month of December. Note that both losses came at the hands of Top 25 teams. The Lady Monarchs lost to then 24th-ranked North Carolina (85-95) to open the month of December, but rallied to win their next three consecutive games. Among the three straight victories was a thrilling 84-80 overtime victory against then 22nd ranked Penn State. Old Dominion closed the final month of 2001 with a 70-84 loss to #1 Connecticut.

2001-02 LADY MONARCH GAME DAY NOTES

TAKE A KID TO THE GAME: Old Dominion will sponsor "Take A Kid To The Game Day" when the Lady Monarchs take on VCU on Jan. 4 and the men's team hosts Drexel on Jan. 5. Fans who purchase an adult ticket will receive a free kids ticket to experience the thrill and excitement of NCAA and Old Dominion Basketball. This year will mark the seventh year the NCAA has sponsored "Take A Kid To The Game Day."

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH: In front of family and friends who traveled from New Mexico, sophomore Myriah Spence has her breakout performance of the year, netting a team and season-high 18 points in Old Dominion's 91-69 victory over Denver on Dec. 20th. The second year guard came off the bench to shoot 7-of-12 from the field, including 4-of-6 from downtown.

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE: Senior Hamchetou Maiga received her undergraduate degree in Information Systems at Old Dominion's graduation ceremony held on December 16th. Maiga was granted her fourth year of eligibility after completing her degree requirements this past summer. She is currently working towards her M.B.A.

HERE'S COMES THE TOP 25: Last Saturday's game against the Huskies marked the fourth Top 25 team that the Lady Monarchs will have faced. December 6th marked the third consecutive game against a Top 25 opponent for the Lady Monarch this season as Old Dominion hosted Penn State. The last time Old Dominion faced three consecutive Top 25 opponents during the regular season was back in early 1987. The Lady Monarchs, who dropped all three matches to their ranked opponents, faced three consecutive Top 10 opponents losing to #1/3 Tennessee, 52-83, at the Hall of Fame Tournament, #10/7 Virginia on the road, 55-57, and #9/8 Maryland at the Fieldhouse (75-90). The last time the Lady Monarchs faced back-to-back Top 25 foes was at the end of January last season. The Lady Monarchs dropped home contests against #3 Tennessee (70-87) and #14 Rutgers (45-69), both of whom appear on this year's schedule as well. On the Old Dominion slate, all but two non-conference opponent (Seton Hall & Denver) are either ranked or has received votes in the current AP and USA TODAY/ESPN Poll.

BIG EAST, BIG FOES: The BIG EAST Conference appears more times on this year's Lady Monarch non-conference schedule than any other conference. Old Dominion will have faced Virginia Tech, Seton Hall, Connecticut, and Rutgers by the year's end. Last year, the BIG EAST conference sent five teams to the NCAA Tournament: Villanova, Virginia Tech, Rutgers, final four participant Connecticut, and national champion Notre Dame.

THREE W'S: With Dec. 14th's 65-52 victory over Seton Hall, the Lady Monarchs put together back-to-back victories for the first time this season. Old Dominion then went on to capture a 91-69 victory over Denver in their last outing to up their winning streak to three straight. The last Old Dominion winning streak occurred at the end of the 2000-01 season as they Lady Monarchs won six in a row, including the championship game of the Colonial Athletic Association for the 10th consecutive year.

A POINT GUARD AT HEART: Senior Tiffany Thompson may be listed as a forward/center, but opponents better watch out for her deadly range. Thompson scored nine of her 11 points against the Pirates on Dec. 14th from downtown. On the season, Thompson has shot 54 percent from behind the arc, making her the best three-point shooter on the team.

EXTRA SESSIONS: December 6th's game marked just the ninth overtime game in Lady Monarch basketball history. The win over Penn State in overtime improved Old Dominion's record in extra sessions to 7-2. The last overtime match-up occurred last year with a tight 85-84 double overtime loss to BIG EAST member Syracuse. Just three overtime games have occurred at the Fieldhouse -- this year's Penn State game, last year's loss to Syracuse, and a 69-65 win over Purdue in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1997. In fact, three of the nine overtime games that Lady Monarchs have played in have been in NCAA Tournament action.

2001-02 LADY MONARCH GAME DAY NOTES

THE REBOUNDS IMPROVE: At one point during the season, head coach Wendy Larry left a note in the locker room telling her team that it was the worst rebounding team she has ever coached. Well the Lady Monarchs certainly got the message as Old Dominion outrebounded Penn State 52-31 on Dec. 6th. In fact, Lucienne Berthieu grabbed a career high 19 boards against the Lady Lions.

RETIREMENT: Redshirt freshman Shareese Grant had her jersey retired at nearby Princess Anne High School in Virginia Beach last Friday. Wearing #24, Grant was a Three-time All-Tidewater Player of the Year, all-district, all-region, and all-state team selection averaging 26.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. Grant became just the second women's basketball player to have her jersey retired at Princess Anne. Fellow teammate, Okeisha Howard was the first.

LADY MONARCHS TAKE TO THE SKY: The Lady Monarchs' outing to Denver was their lone trip on an airplane during the regular season. Old Dominion will be using a bus for their remaining away games.

FROM THE LINE: Old Dominion's woes from the free throw line continue to get better. The Lady Monarchs entered the month of December shooting just 55 percent from the line. Against the Tar Heels on Dec. 2, Old Dominion shot a season-high 80 percent from the charity stripe, which included perfect performances by Okeisha Howard (5-of-5), Sharron Francis (2-of-2), and Kim Giddens (2-of-2). Lucienne Berthieu, who up until that point was shooting just 52 percent from the line, connected on 8-of-11. Entering Dec. 14th's game against Seton Hall, senior Hamchetou Magia was averaging just 33.3 percent from the charity stripe. In perhaps her best performance from the line this season, "Tanty" sank seven of her 11 attempts, accounting for half of her points scored that evening. Okeisha Howard also continued as the team's best free three shooter, sinking all six of her attempts versus the Pirates. Against Denver, the free throws continued to sink as the team hit 77 percent from the line. Berthieu and sophomore Monique Coker, whom both struggled at the beginning of the year from the charity stripe, hit 5-of-6 and 6-of-6 respectively. As a team, the Lady Monarchs are hitting 65 percent from the line, up ten percent from the beginning of the month.

THOMPSON ON THE RESET: Despite Dec. 2nd's loss to the Tar Heels, Tiffany Thompson either tied or reset nearly all her season-highs. The senior logged her first double-double performance of the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds, just the second Lady Monarch

to accomplish this feat yet this season. The only stat marks Thompson did not touch were 3-point field goals attempted and steals.

2-3 WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE: Although the Lady Monarchs began the year 2-3, you can't count this team out. Last year Old Dominion began the season 2-3, captured their 10th straight CAA title and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The 1993-94 version of the Lady Monarchs also began their season 2-3 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament losing to eventual national champion North Carolina. The 1986-87 team also began their season 2-3, but eventually ranked as high as #12 in the AP Poll. That same season, the Lady Monarchs received a first round bye in the NCAA Tournament, upset fourth seeded North Carolina and advanced to the Sweet 16. Don't forget that the 1992-93 squad opened the year 0-4 before compiling a 22-8 record, a CAA Championships, and a second round appearance in the NCAA, bowing out to Final Four participant, Iowa.

NHASSENGO UPDATE: Junior college transfer Evelina "Max" Nhassego will not suit up against the Tribe tonight. Nhassego injured her left knee during practice on November 15th following a collision. She underwent a MRI the next day which determined injury to her medial collateral ligament (MCL) and posterior cruciate ligament (PCL). No timetable for Nhassego's return has been set. Nhassego is currently wearing a brace that allows 70 degrees of motion in her knee and has begun jogging. She has also begun shooting free throws and small jumpers

INTRA-STATE RIVALS: Old Dominion holds a 282-58 record against fellow Virginia schools. Head Coach Wendy Larry has compiled a 134-18 against intra-state rivals. Since becoming a varsity sport in 1969, Old Dominion has had 13 undefeated seasons against Virginia schools. Five schools from the state of Virginia grace this year's schedule (Virginia Tech, Virginia Commonwealth, George Mason, James Madison, and William and Mary). To date, the Lady Monarch hold a 2-1 record, with the last game being a 105-47 victory over William and Mary. Last season, the Lady Monarchs posted a 12-3 record against schools from the Commonwealth.

SU “SPENCE” FUL: Junior guard Alli Spence had a breakout game against Virginia Commonwealth, in the Lady Monarchs second CAA game of the year. Spence logged her first start of the season and came away with 13 points after being held scoreless in the team’s first two outings of the year. She was 5-of-10 from the field, including 3-of-7 from downtown, to end the game as the Lady Monarch’s second leading scorer. Additionally she tied her career high for field goals attempted (10) and three point field goals attempted (7).

LOOK OUT FOR LU: Pre-Season CAA Player of the Year Lucienne Berthieu has seen improvement with each of the Lady Monarch’s three games this season after sitting out the 2000-01 season with a torn ACL. In the season opener against Towson, Berthieu attempted just one shot and recorded three points from the charity stripe. In the following game against Virginia Tech, Berthieu was 3-of-9 from the floor and added three points from the free throw line for nine total. She also added in eight boards. Against VCU, she added in her first double-double performance of the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds. Her shooting improved as well as she hit 3-of-4 from the field and 5-of-7 from the line. Against the 24th ranked Tar Heels, she landed a new season-high with 16 points and against the #21/22 Lady Lions, Berthieu tied her season-high with 16 points and reset her career-high with 19 boards.

ODU’S SPARKPLUG: Junior guard Okeisha Howard came off the Lady Monarch bench to light it up for 20 points in 15 minutes in the win over CAA rival Virginia Commonwealth (70-51). Howard sat out the first half due, but ignited the team with fresh legs and 8-of-11 shooting from the floor. Holding just a four-point edge at halftime (29-25), Old Dominion outscored the Rams 41-26. Howard accounted for nearly 50 percent of the Lady Monarch offense in the second stanza.

FAMILY AFFAIR: Cousins Old Dominion senior guard Sharron Francis and Virginia Commonwealth senior guard Rochelle Luckett spent some quality time together right after Thanksgiving. Francis helped her Lady Monarch team to a 70-51 CAA conference win, while pre-season All-CAA team member Luckett added nine points, six rebounds, and six assists in the Rams defeat. The two relatives face each other at least one more time this season as VCU travels to Norfolk on Jan. 4.

OPENING THE SEASON: The Lady Monarchs have compiled a 25-8 record in season openers. Under Wendy Larry, the Lady Monarchs hold an 12-3 record in season opening games. The 82 points netted by Old Dominion was the largest opening point total by the team since they started the 1999-2000 season with a 91-64 victory over Hampton Roads rival, Hampton. The largest season opening total by the Lady Monarch was against Virginia Union with a 122-62 win.

CONFERENCE OPENER: The Lady Monarchs wasted no time in starting the conference season. The opening regular season game against Towson, also marked the first game in CAA play. It marked the first time in school history that Old Dominion has opened the season with a league game. Although the Lady Monarchs opened against Virginia Commonwealth in 1991 (W, 77-67) and 1992 (L, 67-72), the Rams did not join the CAA until the 1995-96 season. D-D-D-DEFENSE: The Lady Monarchs allowed Towson to net just 29 points in the season opening victory over the Tigers. It was the lowest point total by an opponent since a 83-32 victory over UNC-Wilmington (2/15) and a 78-32 win over William and Mary (2/22) last year. The Tigers netted just 10 points in the first half establishing new Lady Monarch record for fewest points scored in a half by an opponent. The previous record was 11 at James Madison on December 13, 1972.

TIGER TUMBLE: Old Dominion held the Towson Tigers to just 29 points in the 2001-02 season opener. It marked the lowest output by a Tiger team in the school’s history. The previous record was 34 , recorded in a 83-34 loss to Vermont last year.

MAIGA ON THE ASSIST: Old Dominion senior Hamchetou Maiga tied her career high with seven assists against Towson. Maiga also dished out the ball seven times during last year's NCAA run in the tournament's first round against Washington. It also marks the most assist my Maiga in CAA play.

REJECTED: Myriah Spence tied her career high blocking total with two rejections against Towson in the 2001-02 season opener against Towson. Spence also swatted away two opponent shots last season against George Mason on February 25th.

TEN FINGERS, TEN RINGS: Prior to tip-off of the 2001-02 season opener vs. Towson, the Lady Monarchs received their CAA Championship rings. The Lady Monarch have won an NCAA record 10 straight championship titles since joining the CAA during the 1991-92 season.

FAREWELL TO THE FIELDHOUSE: 11 more games (excluding CAA Tournament action) will be playing in the confines of the Fieldhouse before moving over to the new, state-of-the-art, Constant Convocation Center. Throughout the year, Old Dominion will be celebrating the three decades of Lady Monarch history and tradition on the hardwood:

The University of Denver Pioneers jumped out to a 5-0 lead early in the game, but junior guard Okeisha Howard hit two treys and the Lady Monarchs, ranked 25th in both polls were on their way to a 91-69 victory. The Lady Monarchs are now 5-3 on the season, while Denver is now 4-8.

Six Lady Monarchs scored in double figures. Howard finished with 14, sophomore Myriah Spence led with 18, Hamchetou Maiga and Monique Coker each scored 12, Lucienne Berthieu 11 and Tiffany Thompson added ten.

The Lady Monarchs led, 46-33 at halftime and led by as much as 22 with 8:55 left at 70-48. Every Lady Monarch who played scored. Old Dominion shot .500 from the floor (31-62), their second best performance of the season. ODU was also a blistering 9-14 (.643) from three-point range, led by Spence's 4-6 shooting.

Swin Cash scored 19 of her career-high 29 points in the first half, and Sue Bird had 22 points and a handful of great plays to lift No. 1 Connecticut past No. 23 Old Dominion 84-70 Saturday.

Cash did most of her work in close, often after taking passes from Bird. The Huskies (13-0) quashed every rally by the Lady Monarchs (5-4), who lost for the third time to a ranked opponent.

A Lady Monarchs-record crowd of 5,236 at the quaint ODU Fieldhouse jeered the officials over several questionable calls.

Old Dominion was whistled for 28 fouls, the Huskies 21. Still, the Huskies were clearly superior. Bird, a senior, was 8-of-14 from the field and had eight assists, including a dazzling first-half play when she saved a long pass under the basket and delivered a wraparound pass to the trailing Cash for an easy layup.

The Huskies led 46-30 after a 10-point run bridging halftime, but Old Dominion scored 10 of the next 14 to make it 50-40 with 16:16 left.

Diana Taurasi then made her first basket and followed with two free throws for the Huskies, sparking a 10-3 spurt that all but clinched it. Taurasi finished with 16 points.

Lucienne Berthieu, the two-time Colonial Athletic Association player of the year coming back from left knee surgery, scored all but two of her 17 points in the second for the Lady Monarchs.

Okeisha Howard scored 18 for Old Dominion, which shot just 32.4 percent, missing rushed shots from close to the basket throughout the game.

The Lady Monarchs were within 36-30 with 1:15 left in the first half, but Bird scored on a drive, Cash on a layup, and Bird added a 12-footer with just under seven seconds to play, making it 42-30 at the break.

The 24th ranked Lady Monarchs rushed out to a 26-2 lead in the first nine minutes of play in route to a 105-47 Colonial Athletic Association victory over William and Mary. Old Dominion is now 6-4 overall and 3-0 in the CAA, while the Tribe is now 5-4 overall and 0-1 in the league.

Senior Sharron Francis led the way with a double-double with 14 points and a career high ten assists. Junior guard Okeisha Howard was the leading scorer with 20 points, hitting four-of-six from three-point range. Also scoring in double figures were Lucienne Berthieu 13, Hamchetou Maiga 15, Shareese Grant 12 and Monique Coker 11.

With 11:05 left in the first half, ODU led 26-2, hitting 11 of 16 shots from the floor, including 21 straight points before Kia Butts hit two free throws for the Tribe to make it 26-4.

Old Dominion finished the night shooting .544 from the floor, second best this season since the .600 percent shooting against Towson.
