ABOUT SETON HALL: The Seton Hall Pirates, 6-2, are off to their best start since the 1995-96 season, the same year they shared a piece of the BIG EAST 7 regular season title. Hall graduate Phyllis Mangina begins her 17th year at the helm of the women's basketball program at her alma mater. She is Seton Hall's all-time winningest coach and has guided the team to two NCAA tournaments, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1994. Old Dominion is one of three CAA teams on the Pirates' slate this season along with Towson and George Mason. Two local products grace the Seton Hall roster. Sophomore Love Brown, a Second Team All-Region and Honorable Mention All-State, from Booker T. Washington HS in Norfolk and rookie Asia Carroll, a two-time Daily Press All-Star, from Bethel HS in Hampton

2001-02 LADY MONARCH GAME DAY NOTES

EXTRA SESSIONS: Last Thursday's game marked just the ninth overtime game in Lady Monarch basketball history. The win over Penn State in overtime improved Old Dominion 's record in extra sessions to 7-2. The last overtime match-up occurred last year with a tight 85-84 double overtime loss to BIG EAST member Syracuse. Just three overtime games have occurred at the Fieldhouse -- this year's Penn State game, last year's loss to Syracuse, and a 69-65 win over Purdue in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1997. In fact, three of the nine overtime games that Lady Monarchs have played in have been in NCAA Tournament action.

WELCOME BACK RHONDA: Seton Hall assistant coach Rhonda Singleton was a four-year letterwinner for the Lady Monarchs under Wendy Larry from 1990-94. Singleton was apart of Old Dominion's resurgence back into the spotlight in the early 90's helping the Lady Monarchs to three consecutive CAA titles and NCAA tournament appearance. During her career, Singleton's teams compiled a 72-40 record.

THE REBOUNDS IMPROVE: At one point during the season, head coach Wendy Larry left a note in the locker room telling her team that it was the worst rebounding team she has ever coached. Well the Lady Monarchs certainly got the message as Old Dominion outrebounded Penn State 52-31 last Thursday. In fact, Lucienne Berthieu grabbed a career high 19 boards against Penn State in the Lady Monarchs last outing. The Lady Monarchs are ranked 40th in rebounding (+6.8) margin according to the latest NCAA statistics released this week.

RETIREMENT: Redshirt freshman Shareese Grant had her jersey retired at nearby Princess Anne High School in Virginia Beach this past Friday. Wearing #24, Grant was a Three-time All-Tidewater Player of the Year, all-district, all-region, and all-state team selection averaging 26.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game.

BIG EAST, BIG FOES: The BIG EAST Conference appears more times on this year's Lady Monarch non-conference schedule than any other conference. Old Dominion will have faced Virginia Tech, Seton Hall, Connecticut, and Rutgers by the year's end. Last year, the BIG EAST conference sent five teams to the NCAA Tournament: Villanova, Virginia Tech, Rutgers, final four participant Connecticut, and national champion Notre Dame.

GETTING SOME REST: The Lady Monarchs have just five games in the month of December. The time between North Carolina on Dec. 2 and Penn State on Dec. 6 marked the shortest span between games this month with four days. Old Dominion had over a week to rest for tonight's game with Seton Hall and has six days in between tonight's match-up with the Pirates and their next opponent, Denver. The Lady Monarchs resume practice following the Christmas break on Dec. 26th as they prepare for top ranked UConn.

LADY MONARCHS TAKE TO THE SKY: The Lady Monarchs' next outing to Denver will be their lone trip on an airplane during the regular season. Old Dominion will be using a bus for their remaining away games.

HERE'S COMES THE TOP 25: Last Thursday's game against Penn State marked the third consecutive game against a Top 25 opponent for the Lady Monarch this season. The last time Old Dominion faced three consecutive Top 25 opponents during the regular season was back in early 1987. The Lady Monarchs, who dropped all three matches to their ranked opponents, faced three consecutive Top 10 opponents losing to #1/3 Tennessee, 52-83, at the Hall of Fame Tournament, #10/7 Virginia on the road, 55-57, and #9/8 Maryland at the Fieldhouse (75-90). The last time the Lady Monarchs faced back-to-back Top 25 foes was at the end of January last season. The Lady Monarchs dropped home contests against #3 Tennessee (70-87) and #14 Rutgers (45-69), both of whom appear on this year's schedule as well. On the Old Dominion slate, all but two non-conference opponent (Seton Hall & Denver) are either ranked or has received votes in the current AP and USA TODAY/ESPN Poll. On the Lady Lions side, the Penn State slate is chock full of Top 25 action. Three fellow BIG 10 members ranked in the latest polls including #8/7 Purdue, #16 Michigan, and #22/19 Wisconsin. The non-conference portion of their schedule features #3/4 Vanderbilt, #5 Stanford, #17 Texas, as well as #23/25 Old Dominion.

2001-02 LADY MONARCH GAME DAY NOTES

FROM THE LINE: Old Dominion's woes from the free throw line continue to get better. Entering Dec. 2nd's game against the Tar Heels, the Lady Monarchs were connecting on just 55 percent of their chances from the free throw line. Against the Tarheels, Old Dominion shot a season-high 80 percent from the charity stripe, which included perfect performances by Okeisha Howard (5-of-5), Sharron Francis (2-of-2), and Kim Giddens (2-of-2). Lucienne Berthieu, who up until Sunday was shooting just 52 percent from the line, connected on 8-of-11. As a team, the Lady Monarchs are hitting 60 percent from the line, up five percent from their previous two games.

THOMPSON ON THE RESET: Despite Dec. 2nd's loss to the Tar Heels, Tiffany Thompson either tied or reset nearly all her season-highs. The senior logged her first double-double performance of the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds, just the second Lady Monarch to accomplish this feat yet this season. The only stat marks Thompson did not touch were 3-point field goals attempted and steals.

2-3 WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE: Although the Lady Monarchs began the year 2-3, you can't count this team out. Last year Old Dominion began the season 2-3, captured their 10th straight CAA title and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The 1993-94 version of the Lady Monarchs also began their season 2-3 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament losing to eventual national champion North Carolina. The 1986-87 team also began their season 2-3, but eventually ranked as high as #12 in the AP Poll. That same season, the Lady Monarchs received a first round bye in the NCAA Tournament, upset fourth seeded North Carolina and advanced to the Sweet 16. Don't forget that the 1992-93 squad opened the year 0-4 before compiling a 22-8 record, a CAA Championships, and a second round appearance in the NCAA, bowing out to Final Four participant, Iowa.

NHASSENGO UPDATE: Junior college transfer Evelina "Max" Nhassengo will not suit up against the Pirates tonight. Nhassengo injured her left knee during practice on November 15th following a collision. She underwent a MRI the next day which determined injury to her media collateral ligament (MCL) and posterior cruciate ligament (PCL). No timetable for Nhassengo's return has been set. Nhassengo is currently wearing a brace that will allow 40 degrees of motion in her knee and is hoping to move to 70 degrees in the up coming weeks.

INTRA-STATE RIVALS: Old Dominion holds a 281-58 record against fellow Virginia schools. Head Coach Wendy Larry has compiled a 133-18 against intra-state rivals. Since becoming a varsity sport in 1969, Old Dominion has had 13 undefeated season against Virginia schools. Five schools from the state of Virginia grace this year's schedule (Virginia Tech, Virginia Commonwealth, George Mason, James Madison, and William and Mary). To date, the Lady Monarch hold a 1-1 record, with the last game being a 70-51 victory over Virginia Commonwealth. Last season, the Lady Monarchs posted a 12-3 record against schools from the Commonwealth.

SU "SPENCE" FUL: Junior guard Alli Spence had a breakout game against Virginia Commonwealth, in the Lady Monarchs second CAA game of the year. Spence logged her first start of the season and came away with 13 points after being held scoreless in the team's first two outings of the year. She was 5-of-10 from the field, including 3-of-7 from downtown, to end the game as the Lady Monarch's second leading scorer. Additionally she tied her career high for field goals attempted (10) and three point field goals attempted (7).

LOOK OUT FOR LU: Pre-Season CAA Player of the Year Lucienne Berthieu has seen improvement with each of the Lady Monarch's three games this season after sitting out the 2000-01 season with a torn ACL. In the season opener against Towson, Berthieu attempted just one shot and recorded three points from the charity stripe. In the following game against Virginia Tech, Berthieu was 3-of-9 from the floor and added three points from the free throw line for nine total. She also added in eight boards. Against VCU, she added in her first double-double performance of the year with 11 points and 10 rebounds. Her shooting improved as well as she hit 3-of-4 from the field and 5-of-7 from the line. Against the 24th ranked Tar Heels, she landed a new season-high with 16 points and against the #21/22 Lady Lions, Berthieu tied her season-high with 16 points and reset her career-high with 19 boards.

ODU'S SPARKPLUG: Junior guard Okeisha Howard came off the Lady Monarch bench to light it up for 20 points in 15 minutes in the win over CAA rival Virginia Commonwealth (70-51). Howard sat out the first half due, but ignited the team with fresh legs and 8-of-11 shooting from the floor. Holding just a four-point edge at halftime (29-25), Old Dominion outscored the Rams 41-26. Howard accounted for nearly 50 percent of the Lady Monarch offense in the second stanza.

2001-02 LADY MONARCH GAME DAY NOTES

FAMILY AFFAIR: Cousins Old Dominion senior guard Sharron Francis and Virginia Commonwealth senior guard Rochelle Luckett spent some quality time together right after Thanksgiving. Francis helped her Lady Monarch team to a 70-51 CAA conference win, while pre-season All-CAA team member Luckett added nine points, six rebounds, and six assists in the Rams defeat. The two relatives face each other at least on more time this season as VCU travels to Norfolk on Jan. 4.

OPENING THE SEASON: The Lady Monarchs have compiled a 25-8 record in season openers. Under Wendy Larry, the Lady Monarchs hold an 12-3 record in season opening games. The 82 points netted by Old Dominion was the largest opening point total by the team since they started the 1999-2000 season with a 91-64 victory over Hampton Roads rival, Hampton. The largest season opening total by the Lady Monarch was against Virginia Union with a 122-62 win.

CONFERENCE OPENER: The Lady Monarchs wasted no time in starting the conference season. The opening regular season game against Towson, also marked the first game in CAA play. It marked the first time in school history that Old Dominion has opened the season with a league game. Although the Lady Monarchs opened against Virginia Commonwealth in 1991 (W, 77-67) and 1992 (L, 67-72), the Rams did not join the CAA until the 1995-96 season. The Lady Monarchs are 11-0 in Colonial Athletic Association Conference openers.

D-D-D-DEFENSE: The Lady Monarchs allowed Towson to net just 29 points in the season opening victory over the Tigers. It was the lowest point total by an opponent since a 83-32 victory over UNC-Wilmington (2/15) and a 78-32 win over William and Mary (2/22) last year. The Tigers netted just 10 points in the first half establishing new Lady Monarch record for fewest points scored in a half by an opponent. The previous record was 11 at James Madison on December 13, 1972.

TIGER TUMBLE: Old Dominion held the Towson Tigers to just 29 points in the 2001-02 season opener. It marked the lowest output by a Tiger team in the school's history. The previous record was 34, recorded in a 83-34 loss to Vermont last year.

MAIGA ON THE ASSIST: Old Dominion senior Hamchetou Maiga tied her career high with seven assists against Towson. Maiga also dished out the ball seven times during last year's NCAA run in the tournament's first round against Washington. It also marks the most assist my Maiga in CAA play.

REJECTED: Myriah Spence tied her career high blocking total with two rejections against Towson in the 2001-02 season opener against Towson. Spence also swatted away two opponent shots last season against George Mason on February 25th.

TEN FINGERS, TEN RINGS: Prior to tip-off of the 2001-02 season opener vs. Towson, the Lady Monarchs received their CAA Championship rings. The Lady Monarch have won an NCAA record 10 straight championship titles since joining the CAA during the 1991-92 season.

FAREWELL TO THE FIELDHOUSE: 11 more games (excluding CAA Tournament action) will be playing in the confines of the Fieldhouse before moving over to the new, state-of-the-art, Constant Convocation Center. Throughout the year, Old Dominion will be celebrating the three decades of Lady Monarch history and tradition on the hardwood:

ANOTHER NEW FACE: The Lady Monarchs added Kelly Hill, a walk-on from Louisiana to this year's roster. Hill, who averaged 15 points and seven rebounds at De La Salle High School, will be wearing number 15.

WE'RE PICKED NUMBER ONE: Old Dominion was the unanimous choice of the media to win the 2001-02 CAA women's basketball championship in a vote taken Wednesday at CAA basketball media day at the ESPNZone in Baltimore. The #24 North Carolina women's basketball team held off a late rally by #17 Old Dominion to win, 95-85. With the win, UNC improves to 7-1 while ODU falls to 2-3.

Both teams seemed up to the challenge early, with UNC racing to a ten point lead early on and Old Dominion resolutely chipping away. The Tar Heels led at the half, 45-39, but Old Dominion held a 24-21 edge in rebounds and held a .457 to .400 shooting advantage.

The Lady Monarchs went ahead early in the second-half on a Okeisha Howard jumper, but the Tar Heels regained their lead just minutes later on a Candace Sutton score. Although twice the Tar Heels managed to hold a six-point edge, the Lady Monarchs did not rest continually eating away at the North Carolina lead resulting in five lead changes in the final eight minutes.

Howard gave Old Dominion the lead for the first time since early in the second half following two free throws at the seven minute mark, but North Carolina used a 10-2 run to seal the game. Nikki Teasley sank both free throws to push the lead back to seven for UNC, and the visitors were able to clamp down in the final moments.

Overall, five UNC players recorded double-digit scoring performances, led by forward Nikki Teasley, who scored a season-high 27 points to go along with six rebounds.

Old Dominion was paced by junior guard Okeisha Howard who led the team with 18 points and 4 assists. Senior center Tiffany Thompson put in eleven points and recorded a game-high ten rebounds, both season-highs, for her first double-double performance of the year.

Keyed by junior guard Okeisha Howard's game-tying shot with .05 left in regulation, the 25th-ranked Old Dominion women's basketball team surged past #21 Penn State in overtime, 84-80. The Lady Monarchs improve to .500 with the win to stand at a 3-3 mark, while Penn State falls to 4-3 on the year.

In a wild game that featured 18 ties and 17 lead changes, the Lady Monarchs were finally able to get the upper hand on the Lady Lions, outscoring them 11-7 in the extra session thanks to seven points from Lucienne Berthieu and two key free-throws by junior guard Alli Spence. Penn State nearly stole the game again as time expired, stealing a inbounds pass from ODU with seven seconds left and converting to make it a 82-80 game. Berthieu finally ended the affair by collecting a key rebound and putting in her final bucket of the night to send the Lady Monarchs to victory, 84-80.

Old Dominion and Penn State were evenly matched from the floor as both the Lady Lions and the Lady Monarchs connected on 45 percent of their shots, however Old Dominion controlled the boards the entire night out-rebounding the Lady Lions 52-31.

It was the Lady Monarchs' first win over a Top 25 opponent this season, after falling to #24 North Carolina and #8/9 North Carolina State in their previous two outings.

Penn State's Kelly Mazzante led all scorers with 37 points, a new season-high and just one short of her career best. Rashana Barnes tallied her first double-double of the season with 20 points and 10 boards. Barnes was also a perfect 8-of-8 from the free throw line. Katrena Carr came off the bench to net 11 points in her first game back from injury.

In all, five Lady Monarchs reached double digit scoring numbers. The Lady Monarchs had two players register double-double performances. Hamchetou Maiga logged a new season-high in points (16) and rebounds (10), while Berthieu tied her career-high in rebounds (17) and season-high in points (16). Howard netted 15 points, while Monique Coker and Sharron Francis added 11 and 10 points respectively off the bench.
