ABOUT THE LADY MONARCH FIELD HOCKEY TEAM:



- The Lady Monarchs will travel to Louisville, Kentucky in their quest to bring home their 10th national championship trophy and first since 2001. Old Dominion is making its 16th appearance in the Final Four. Last was in 2002 when Old Dominion fell to Penn State in the national semifinals. That game took place at Trager Stadium, site of this year's Final Four.

- The Lady Monarchs entered the NCAA Tournament having received the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) automatic bid last weekend. Old Dominion defeated William & Mary, 3-1, in the league's semifinals and blanked Northeastern, 3-0, in the tournament finale.

- Entering Final Four action, the Lady Monarchs are winners of their last eight outings and have won 16 of their last 17 games. The lone blemish during that stretch was a 2-3 setback to

Final Four participant and then #3 Duke. In their 19-5 record, all five losses are to NCAA Tournament participants ranked in the Top Seven of the final STX/NFHCA Poll and have been by one goal.

- The Old Dominion field hockey team has a long storied NCAA tradition. Winners of a record nine NCAA Championships, the Lady Monarchs are the only Division I field hockey team to advance to every tournament since its inception in 1981. In all, the Lady Monarchs hold a 46-15 NCAA Tournament record with their most recent national championship coming in 2000.

- Entering tournament action, Old Dominion held a 5-5 record against team in the 2005 tournament field, including a 4-1 victory over the NCAA's top seed, Maryland. The Lady Monarchs also posted victories against third seeded Duke, North Carolina, Penn State, and Richmond. In fact, all five losses (Maryland, American, Michigan, Duke, and North Carolina) were only by one goal.

- In the final STX/NFHCA Coaches Poll released last Wednesday, the Lady Monarch field hockey team had their highest ranking of the year coming in at No. 3. Old Dominion lowest ranking was at No. 9 in the first poll of the year. The Lady Monarchs hold a 4-5 record against the Top 10 and a 7-5 record against the Top 20. Old Dominion split contests in home-and-home series against #1 Maryland, #4 Duke, and #5 North Carolina.

- The Lady Monarchs currently own seven shutouts on the 2005 season which have included North Carolina, Virginia, and Miami (Ohio), along with CAA rivals Drexel, Virginia Commonwealth, Hofstra, and Northeastern in the CAA Tournament finale.

DID YOU KNOW.....????????????????

- Old Dominion is the only school to have appeared in every NCAA Tournament since its inception in 1981.

- The Lady Monarchs have won an NCAA record nine national championships...1982, 1983, 1984, 1988, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1998, 2000

- Of the their 25 NCAA Tournament appearances the Lady Monarchs have made, Old Dominion has reached the Final Four 16 times. This year's Final Four appearance is the first since 2002.

- Last time the Lady Monarch reached the Final Four was in 2002 when the NCAA semifinals and finals were held at Louisville, the same site of the 2005 Final Four

- Six members of the 2005 Old Dominion field hockey team were members of the last Final Four Lady Monarch squad back in 2002. They included Mary Cate Gordon, Anna Rogers, Darcy Pinchbeck, Rosanna Delutis, Jennifer Angate, Janelle Engle. Angat and Engle both saw time on the turf in the 2002 semifinals against Penn State as freshmen.

25th NCAA ANIVERSARY TEAM:

In conjunction with the 25th anniversary of the NCAA Division I Field Hockey Championships, the NCAA has announced the 25th Anniversary Division I Field Hockey Team, which includes former Lady Monarch field hockey legends Marina DiGiacomo, Christy Morgan, and Robin Smith along with veteran head coach Beth Anders.

Marina DiGiacomo, Old Dominion, Midfielder

- NCAA All Tournament (1997, 98, 2000)
- NCAA National Champion (1998, 2001)
- Honda Broderick Field Hockey Player of the Year (2000)
- All American (1999, 2000)

Marina DiGiacomo, current ODU assistant coach, is the NCAA's all-time leading scorer and a member of two national championship teams. During her Old Dominion career (1997-2000), DiGiacomo was a two-time AstroTurf/NFCA All-American, a four-time Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Year, four-time CAA Tournament MVP. She is the only player in the history of field hockey to be ranked in the top three of each statistical category (goals, assists, points). DiGiacomo made an incredible mark in the NCAA record books with 414 points on 167 goals and 80 assists during her career ranking her first in points, third in goals, and fourth all-time in assists. With DiGiacomo on the turf, the Lady Monarchs captured an outstanding 87-13 record including national championship in 1998 with a 23-2 overall mark and in 2000 with a 25-1 record. The Argentina native won the prestigious Honda Award trophy her senior season during the Lady Monarchs' 2000 campaign, which ended with Old Dominion's ninth national championship trophy. She became the fifth Lady Monarch to earn the National Player of the Year award leading the nation with an outstanding 151 points from 63 goals and 25 assists. DiGiacomo was a member of the Argentine National Team helping her native country to a bronze medal at the 2004 Olympic Games and the gold medal at the 2004 Pan American Cup.

Christy Morgan, Old Dominion, Forward

Christy Morgan is the only three-time All-American in ODU field hockey history, and is the only field hockey player in NCAA history to earn a spot on the all-tournament team four times. Morgan earned the sports top honor in 1985 as she was awarded the Broderick Cup, as being the nation's top female collegiate athlete. During her four years, ODU won three consecutive NCAA national Championships from 1981-84. Morgan completed her career as then ODU's all-time leading scorer with 86 career goals and 133 career points. She is also the school's fifth all-time assist leader with 47. During her career at ODU, Morgan was a member of the World Cup team, an alternate on the 1984 United States Olympic squad and later a member of the 1988 United States Olympic team

Robin Smith, Old Dominion, Back

Robin Smith was an integral part in the Lady Monarchs field hockey dominance in the early 1990's. She helped lead Old Dominion to three straight NCAA National Championships and was a three-time NCAA All-Tournament selection in 1990, 1991 and 1992. During her four years at Old Dominion, the Lady Monarchs compiled a 98-4-1 record, and two undefeated seasons. A two-time All-American, Smith was a member of the United States National field hockey team from 1990 to 1992, and played on the 12th ranked 1990 World Cup team and the 1991 bronze medal team at the Pan American games. The three-time All-South Region pick completed her career with 66 goals, 18 assists for 150 points.

Beth Anders, Old Dominion, Coach

Beth Anders has cemented her status as one of the greatest in field hockey in all facets of the game. As player, she has participated at every level possible, including World Cup and Olympic events and as a coach. Her coaching achievements are nothing short of impressive, including nine national collegiate titles, a bronze medal at the Pan American World Cup Games, and the distinction of being the winningest Division I field hockey coach in the country.



HEAD COACH: BETH ANDERS

Two words describe Old Dominion field hockey coach Beth Anders...Proven Winner.

Anders has cemented her status as one of the greatest in field hockey in all facets of the game. As player, she has participated at every level possible, including World Cup and Olympic events and as a coach. Her coaching achievements are nothing short of impressive, including nine national collegiate titles, a bronze medal at the Pan American World Cup Games, and the distinction of being the winningest Division I field hockey coach in the country. Considered by many to be a pioneer of her sport, her resume is dotted with a long list of incredible achievements and monumental firsts.

At Old Dominion, Anders has mentored the field hockey team for over 22 years and has led her teams to perennial appearances in the NCAA tournament. Under her tutelage, the Lady Monarchs have achieved more honors than any other field hockey program in NCAA history. Among the most prestigious, Anders and her teams have brought the NCAA Championship trophy back to Norfolk an unprecedented nine times, including the most recent in 2000. In addition, the Lady Monarchs have won the CAA crown 12 of 14 times since joining the league in 1991 with Anders on the sidelines and remain the only team to make all 25 NCAA Tournaments dating back to 1981.

In national coaching records, Anders has coached more games than any other active Division I coach, having been on the sidelines for over 500 games during her 22-year career. She became the first Division I coach to reach the 400-career victory mark, a milestone only reached by four other coaches in the sport, and Anders' wins are the most of any Division I coach in history.

Anders' coaching experience has not been limited to the Old Dominion sidelines. Internationally, Anders guided the 1991 U.S. National Team to the bronze medal and masterminded the qualifying campaign for the 1994 World Cup. Most recently, in the summer of 2003, Anders was asked to take over the U.S. National Team and prepare them for the Pan American games in the Dominican Republic, the stepping stone necessary to qualifying for the Olympic Games.

The love affair between Anders and field hockey, however, goes well beyond her immediate reign in the coaching ranks. In 1980, Anders made the first of two Olympic field hockey teams as co-captain, but was forced- because of the boycott in Moscow- to wait four more years to realize her dream of winning a medal. In 1984 though, nothing stood in the way of Anders and her teammates as they cashed in on a bronze medal at the Los Angeles games. Anders, whose strong penalty corner was consistently clocked in the 90 m.p.h. range, nearly single handedly lifted the US team to victory, scoring eight of her team's nine goals in its five-game performance for an Olympic record that still stands today.

Throughout her international playing career, Anders played in over 100 international matches, was a participant in every World Cup from 1971-84, was on the National team from 1969-1980, and was the high scorer for the United States every year she was on the team. Anders participated in the first World Cup field hockey event to have both men's and women's competition at the same venue. She was one of just 24 field hockey coaches from around the world to be in attendance for a clinic during the 1998 World Cup in Holland.

After three NCAA titles as coach of Old Dominion and a bronze medal as a player and two-time captain with the Olympic team, Anders was named Olympic Athlete of the Year and Virginia Coach of the Year in 1984. Bringing the two realms of the sport together, Anders was recognized for her many contributions with an induction into the United States Field Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Anders' love for her sport is infectious as many former Old Dominion athletes have grown into respectable players and coaches in and around the world's field hockey family. Nine former Old Dominion players coached by Anders have participated in the last three Olympics.

Anders challenges her teams to not only excel on the field, but in the classroom as well. Since 1989, the Lady Monarch teams have had a G.P.A. of 3.0 or better. This past season, the team put forth six National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) Academic All-Americans. Certainly the epitome of Anders' student-athletes is Samantha Salvia, the school's first ever Rhodes Scholar who graduated in 1996 with a 4.0 GPA in environmental and civil engineering.

The key to Anders success on and off the field hockey field seems to be her love for and dedication to the game. Her development of the Futures Program during her national coaching stint in 1993 and her active mentoring of the field hockey youth are just two examples of her will to succeed better than anyone in her vocation.

A fine all-around athlete herself, Anders was a four-time All-College field hockey and lacrosse player before graduating from Ursinus College with a B.S. degree in health and physical education. The Norristown, PA. native was also selected to the national collegiate basketball team and won the intercollegiate squash championship in 1970.

Anders is the daughter of Alice and Stanley Anders. She has one brother and enjoys fitness, golf, tennis, reading, and creative teaching tools. She also authored two books, Field Hockey: Steps to Success published in 1999 and Lesson in Field Hockey released in 1996.

An avid golfer, Anders resides in Virginia Beach.
