● **LET'S GO TO THE BEACH:** It's time for the 2006 Colonial Athletic Association Tournament at the National Training Center in Virginia Beach Virginia. The seeds and semi-finals match-ups are set. In quarterfinal action, No. 4 Northeastern defeated No. 5 William & Mary, 4-1, to advance to play top seeded Old Dominion in the semifinals while No. 3 Hofstra defeated No. 6 Delaware, 2-1, in a come from behind victory to advance to the semifinals to take on second seeded James Madison. The Lady Monarchs and Huskies square off on Saturday at noon, while the Dukes and Pride battle at 2:30 p.m. The winners advance to Sunday's championship game and a berth to the 16-team NCAA Tournament at 1:00 p.m.

● **TICKETS:** Admission prices are \$5 for adults, \$3 for youth, and free admission for students with ID. A festival pass is

available to gain entry to both the field hockey and men's and women's soccer championships being held at the Sportsplex right next to the National Training Center. The festival pass is \$20 for adults, \$15 for youth, and \$50 for a family four pack.

● **DIRECTIONS:** The National Training Center is located at 2181 Landstown Rd in Virginia Beach (23456). From I 64, take the Indian River Road East exit (286B). Merger onto Indian River Road. At the fork, stay left on Ferrell Parkway. Take the Princess Anne Road East Exit at the end of Ferrell Parkway. Follow Princess Anne Road to Dam Neck Road. Turn Right onto Dam Neck Road, then left onto Landstown Road. The facility entrance is on the left side of the Sportsplex. You can also log onto www.usfieldhockey.com/usfha/training_center.htm.

● **WHO MAKES THE CUT?:** The Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Player, Rookie, Defensive, and Coach of the Year along with First, Second, and Rookie All-CAA Teams will be announced on Friday night. Log onto www.odusports.com and www.caasports.com to see which Lady Monarchs will earn all-conference awards.

● **TAKING THE CONFERENCE BY STORM:** Old Dominion went a perfect 8-0 in CAA play in 2006 marking the 12th time the Lady Monarchs have been undefeated in conference action. During the eight games of CAA play, only Northeastern has scored on Old Dominion with the Lady Monarchs defeating the Huskies, 3-2, in overtime. To date CAA opposition has been outscored 42-2, outshot 204-23 and outcornered 141-16.

● **OLD DOMINION IN THE CAA TOURNAMENT:** Old Dominion is winners of 13 CAA Championship Trophies (1991-1994, 1996-2003, 2005) most recently earning the conference title last season with a 5-0 victory over Northeastern. James Madison in 1995 and Delaware in 2003 are the only two schools to capture CAA titles since Old Dominion joined the league in 1991.

● **LET'S HEAR IT FOR THE "D":** Redshirt goalkeeper Kelly Driscoll and the Old Dominion defense continue are making it awfully hard for the opposition to score. Old Dominion currently boasts the top-ranked defense in the nation only allowing 0.64 goals per game. Only three schools this season have managed to score more than once, Duke in the double overtime first meeting, Virginia, and semi-final opponent Northeastern in a match-up that saw overtime. The Lady Monarchs have posted 11 shutouts, including a streak of six straight before its loss to #1 Maryland. Additionally, Old Dominion shutout all but one CAA opponent - the 3-2 overtime win versus Northeastern. At home, Maryland and Northeastern were the only opponents to score on Foreman Field. Driscoll meanwhile leads the nation in goals against average as only 13 opponent shots have gotten past the ODU goalkeeper in 20 games.

● **THIS IS HOW WE START:** Old Dominion started off the season with a 13-1 start, the best start by the program since 2000. That season the Lady Monarchs won the first two games of the season before falling to Maryland. The loss against the Terps would be the only that season as the Lady Monarchs rattled off 23 straight victories and brought home its last national championship. The 2006 campaign kicked off with a 3-0 start, its best start to a season since they started off the 2002 Final Four season 3-0 as well. Again it was Maryland who halted the winning streak this season and also back in 2002.

● **HATS OFF:** Sophomore Denise Admiraal became the first Lady Monarch to collect a hat trick this season as the mid-fielder captured three goals as one of four goal scorers in a 7-0 win against Towson. The hat trick was Admiraal's second of her career with the first against Delaware in last season's 6-2 win. The following weekend senior Darcy Pinchbeck became the second Lady Monarch to net three goals in a game as she was one of six goal scorers in a 10-0 route of Virginia Commonwealth.

● **LAST TIME VS. NORTHEASTERN:** The third-ranked Old Dominion field hockey team needed overtime to dispatch Northeastern, 3-2, back on October 21st. The Huskies struck first 10 minutes into the contest. Playing off a penalty corner, Northeastern's Rachel Wilkes managed to collect the rebound off a missed shot and send into the back of the Lady Monarch cage. By the end of the first half, Old Dominion would score twice heading into the locker room up 2-1. On a penalty corner, senior Caroline Nichols, off the insert from classmate Dana Sensenig and stick stop by Titia Beek, tied the game with just over six and a half minutes left in the half. Three minutes later Old Dominion had the lead after sophomore Denise Admiraal passed to ball off to leading scorer Sensenig for a goal. The tally was Sensenig's team-leading 15th of the season. The Lady Monarchs had control of the ball most of the season half. With time winding down, Old Dominion took a penalty corner and held the ball in the corner. Northeastern managed to take possession, race up field, and enter the circle. Harriet Hoyer got her stick on the ball in a sea of Lady Monarch defenders and found the gap with 1:31 left in regulation to tie the game and send it into overtime. Overtime, ODU's second of the 2006 season, didn't last very long as the Lady Monarchs gained possession of the ball and scored 1:59 into the third stanza. Admiraal captured the golden goal off a feed from Sensenig. Old Dominion outshot Northeastern, 13-5, and outcornered the Huskies, 12-3. Lady Monarch goalkeeper Kelly Driscoll made three stops in the victory, while her counterpart, Liz Centofanti stopped six Old Dominion shots on net.

● **LAST TIME VS. JAMES MADISON:** Sophomore Nico van Nispen captured third-ranked Old Dominion's lone goal it a 1-0 victory over #17 James Madison back on September 29th at the JMU Field Hockey complex. The win gave the Lady Monarchs its seventh straight win as they improved to 10-1 overall and 2-0 in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). The shutout was also Old Dominion's third straight and fifth overall this season. James Madison fell to 6-5 in their CAA opener. Van Nispen's goal came off a penalty corner with 7:13 left in the game. Senior Dana Sensenig (Denver, Pa.) and freshman Titia Beek were credited with the assists. Although Old Dominion scored only one goal, they controlled much of the offense as the Lady Monarchs outshot the Dukes, 14-2. Both James Madison shots came in the first half, with only Lauren Stefaniak's shot reaching net on penalty corner resulting in the lone save by Lady Monarch keeper Kelly Driscoll. Old Dominion outcornered James Madison, 10-2.

● **LAST TIME VS. HOFSTRA:** The third-ranked Old Dominion field hockey team improved its mark to 16-2 overall and 6-0 in CAA play with its 10th shutout of the year in a 7-0 victory over No. 20 Hofstra at Foreman Field back on October 22nd. The Pride fell to 10-6 overall and 3-3 in CAA action. The Lady Monarchs dominated the offense outshooting the Pride 33-5 and holding a 19-2 advantage in corners. Old Dominion did not get onto the scoreboard until the last remaining seconds of the first half. Although the Lady Monarchs had 13 penalty corner attempts and 15 shots on net in the first stanza, sophomore Jo Ann van Aswegen was the only one to get past Hofstra goalkeeper Jessica Cowperthwait. Van Aswegen's goal with 29.3 seconds remaining in the first half would be the eventual game-winner, her second of the year. The second half saw the Lady Monarch offense rattle off five answered goals. Sophomore Katelyn Smither started the scoring barrage with just over 17 minutes remaining as she capitalized on a rebound off a penalty corner shot. Less than two minutes later, fellow classmate Nico van Nispen gave ODU a 3-0 lead with another rebound off a penalty corner shot. Freshman Titia Beek (Heiloo, Holland) was the only Lady Monarch to score more than once. She tallied her first career goal as she positioned herself in front of the Pride net off a pass from senior Darcy Pinchbeck just under the eight-minute mark. Two minutes later, Beek scored again to give the Lady Monarchs a 5-0 edge. Sophomore Denise Admiraal rounded out the day's scoring with a little under five minutes remaining in the game. Admiraal's goal was her 10th of the season. Hofstra netminder Cowperthwait made 19 saves in the onslaught of Lady Monarch shots. Nadine Surak played the final five minutes in the cage for the Pride after Cowperthwait received a yellow card and made two stops. Pride defensive member Shannon Alexander also recorded a defensive save. Redshirt freshman keeper Kelly Driscoll made four saves in net.

- **2005 TOURNAMENT RECAP - SEMIFINALS:** Old Dominion got goals from a trio of All-CAA honorees to defeat William & Mary, 3-1, in the semifinals of the 2005 CAA Tournament held at Old Dominion back on November 5th, 2005. Player of the Year Janelle Engle and Dana Sensenig each scored their eighteenth goals of the season, while Daphne Admiraal chipped in one of her own. Sophomore Kim Hedley netted the Tribe's lone goal. Sensenig got the Lady Monarchs started early when she gained possession of the ball just outside the circle and weaved her way through the William & Mary defense before pushing it past Tribe goalkeeper Gwen Hunter, who made six saves in the game. About ten minutes later, a William & Mary defender was able to deflect an Engle shot away from the net, but Admiraal was there waiting to put it back in past the recovering Tribe defense. Early in the second half, Sensenig passed the ball in from a penalty corner to junior Caroline Nichols (Va. Beach, Va.), who set it up for Engle to fire in for the Lady Monarchs' third goal. A few minutes later, Hedley managed to get the Tribe on the board when she put in a rebound of her own shot, but it was too little, too late as Old Dominion held on for the victory.
- **2005 TOURNAMENT RECAP - FINALS:** The Old Dominion field hockey team has advanced to its 25th NCAA Tournament appearance as they captured its 13th CAA title with a 3-0 shutout over Northeastern on Sunday at Foreman Field on November 6th, 2005. Duffy came charging out to cut down the angle on the shot, but McLenegan was able to get it by the oncoming keeper and into the cage for the 2-0 lead. The third and final score was started once again by Pinchbeck, who centered a pass from the left side of the circle. Freshman Katelyn Smither (Suffolk, Va.) came charging in to meet it and took a diving shot that found the back of the net to give the Lady Monarchs the 3-0 lead. Old Dominion goalkeeper Mary Cate Gordon made six saves to post the shutout. Duffy made eight saves for the Huskies, who were outshot 18-7 and outcornered 6-2.
- **NICO VAN NISPEN NAMED CAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Sophomore midfielder Nico van Nispen was named the CAA Player of the Week after collecting seven points off three goals and an assist in the Lady Monarchs' 2-0 win during the week ending October 2nd. Van Nispen registered both game-winners against #17 James Madison and Towson as Old Dominion posted its eighth straight victory and fourth straight shutout. On Friday night, the sophomore midfielder tallied the lone goal in the James Madison victory and van Nispen was one of four different Lady Monarch goal scorers and one of two multiple goal scorers versus Towson.
- **NICHOLS NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Senior defender Caroline Nichols became the second Lady Monarch to earn a CAA weekly honor as she was named the conference's Player of the Week for the week ending September 10th. The senior defender anchored the Old Dominion backfield which boasted two shutouts last week, as the Lady Monarchs picked up two wins against ranked opponents. Nichols' defensive effort helped ODU to its first shutout in a 3-0 victory over #19 Richmond as the Spiders were held to four total shots including just one in the first half. She followed by helping the Lady Monarchs to back-to-back shutouts with a 2-0 victory over #20 Michigan. Along with helping to keep the Wolverines without a shot in the first half, Nichols captured the game-winner as she drilled home a shot on a Lady Monarch penalty corner attempt.
- **NICHOLS CLAIMS ANOTHER AWARD:** Not only was senior defender Caroline Nichols named the CAA Player of the Week for her efforts last week, she was also named to the Women's Field Hockey.com honor roll.
- **NICHOLS NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK - AGAIN:** For the second straight week senior defender Caroline Nichols has been named the Colonial Athletic Association Player of the Week. Nichols helped ODU extend its winning streak to four games as the Lady Monarchs defeated #4 North Carolina and #5 Duke. Defensively, Nichols helped hold the Tar Heels to only one goal as they gave North Carolina its first loss of the season. North Carolina had been averaging 4.00 goals per game, fifth nationally, entering the weekend. On Sunday against Duke, Nichols captured the game-winner with 5:55 remaining in the second overtime to lift ODU to the win over the 2005 national runner-ups. After falling behind 3-1 at the half, Nichols and the defense did not allow the Blue Devils to find the back of the ODU net the rest of the afternoon.
- **NICHOLS CLAIMS ANOTHER AWARD - AGAIN:** Not only was senior defender Caroline Nichols named the CAA Player of the Week for her second straight week, she was also named to the Women's Field Hockey.com honor roll for a second consecutive week as well.
- **FACES IN THE CROWD:** Freshman Katie Ueberroth was featured in Sports Illustrated's September 18th issue in the weekly magazine's "Faces In the Crowd" feature. Ueberroth earned the honor after being named the CAA's Rookie of the Week the first week of the season. The freshman midfielder came off the Lady Monarch bench helping ODU to a 3-1 victory over #7 Penn State and a 6-1 win over Ohio with two goals and an assist. She tallied ODU's third and final goal against the Nittany Lions and then followed by assisting Sami McLenegan's game-winner in Sunday's win over Ohio and scoring the Lady Monarchs' sixth and final goal of the game.
- **KATIE UEBERROTH NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:** Freshman Katie Ueberroth earned the Lady Monarchs first CAA weekly award as she was named the Rookie of the Week for the first week of the season. The freshman midfielder came off the Lady Monarch bench helping ODU to a 3-1 victory over #7 Penn State and a 6-1 win over Ohio with two goals and an assist. She tallied ODU's third and final goal against the Nittany Lions and then followed by assisting Sami McLenegan's game-winner in Sunday's win over Ohio and scoring the Lady Monarchs' sixth and final goal of the game.
- **FACES ON THE BENCH:** Look over to the opponent bench and you just might see a familiar face. The first four weeks of the season saw an Old Dominion tie on its opponent coaching staff. Penn State, who ODU opened the season against, is coached by Char Morrett, a former ODU assistant, Maryland assistant Marybeth Freeman ('03) was a NCAA All-Tournament Team goalkeeper, Lynn Farquhar ('04) returned to Foreman Field as an assistant coach with the University of Richmond, and Tara Hermann ('03) serves as a volunteer assistant with the Duke program, while Blue Devil head coach Beth Bozman spent a season as a graduate assistant with the ODU program. Old Dominion saw another familiar face at Delaware and Virginia Commonwealth. Fightin' Blue Hen assistant coach Dawn Hill ('86) guided ODU to three NCAA titles in 1982, 1983, and 1984 and also served as an assistant coach with the Lady Monarchs. Hill is also an Old Dominion Hall of Fame inductee. Rams' head coach Shelly Behren ('88) helped the Lady Monarchs to the title in 1984 and a runner-up placing in 1985.
- **RANK 'EM UP:** So far to date the Lady Monarchs are 10-2 against ranked competition. ODU is 5-2 against Top Ten opponents with a win against #4/8 North Carolina, #4/5 Duke, and #7 Penn State, and two losses to #1 Maryland.
- **THE WINNINGEST DIVISION I COACH:** At the helm of the Old Dominion women's field hockey program is the winningest Division I coach in history, Beth Anders. To date, Anders boasts a 479-80-7 overall mark and is only one of six coaches overall and active Division I coaches to reach the 400-win milestone. She entered the 2006 season as the all-time winningest Division I coach and third all-time winningest coach in NCAA history.
- **FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE NEWS - NCAA WOMAN OF THE YEAR:** Former Lady Monarch field hockey defender and 2006 Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year Janelle Engle (Mt. Joy, Pa.) was one of nine finalists for the 2006 Woman of the Year. Since 1991, the award has been presented annually to a senior student-athlete who has distinguished herself throughout her collegiate career in the areas of academic achievement, athletics excellence, service and leadership. Engle was named the 2006 CAA Player of the Year and earned first team All-American honors by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA). She led ODU and the CAA in scoring with 20 goals. She was selected by the ODU Alumni Association as the Female Athlete of the Year and the Norfolk Sports Club presented her with the Tom Scott award as the university's top senior athlete. In the classroom, Engle was a four-time NFHCA All-Academic selection, a USA TODAY All-USA College Academic Team nominee, and was the CAA's Scholar Athlete of the Year. Engle was a co-winner of the prestigious Jack Wilkins/James Howard Female Scholar Athletes of the Year at ODU as she attained a perfect 4.0. A music major, Engle was first violinist in the Deihn String Quartet and concertmaster of the ODU Symphony.

- **FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE NEWS - WORLD CUP:** Three former Lady Monarchs, Honda Award winner Tiffany Snow, All-American Angie Loy, and defensive specialist Melissa Leonetti, helped Team USA to a sixth place finish at the 2006 World Cup in Madrid Spain. The USA fell to Argentina, 2-1 and Australia, 3-1, but drew 0-0 with Korea and picked up a 3-1 win over South Africa and 1-0 win over Korea to advance to the 5th-8th playoff game. Loy was one of three goal scorers in the win against South Africa. Snow scored the lone goal in the 1-0 upset over Germany in the playoff game and then took home sixth place with a 1-0 loss to Japan. The three Lady Monarchs helped the US Field Hockey team to its second highest showing at a World Cup since a third place finish in 1994 and only the third top six finish for a USA team since the team's first World Cup appearance in 1983.
- **FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE NEWS - COACH OF THE YEAR:** Former Lady Monarch Elizabeth Sharpe ('05) was named Co-Coach of the Year in the Virginia Beach District for High School field hockey. She is in her first year as head coach of the Ocean Lakes Dolphins where she led her team to an 11-2 regular season run, a second place finish in the district tourney, and qualified for the Eastern Regional Tournament .
- **COMING UP:** Get your television set to CSTV on Tuesday, November 7,th at 7:30 p.m. at the 16-teams for the 2006 NCAA Field Hockey Tournament are revealed along with the four host sites of the first and second rounds.

2005 NCAA RECAPS:

FIRST ROUND

Old Dominion vs. Ohio State Columbus, Ohio - November 12, 2005

In a physical and see-saw game, the Old Dominion field hockey team prevailed with a 5-4 victory over host Ohio State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Darcy Pinchbeck would score what would be the eventual game-winner in the 57th minute of play to send the Lady Monarchs to the second round.

Neither team managed more than a one goal lead in the contest and the game was tied at 3-3 at halftime. CAA Rookie of the Year Denise Admiraal opened up scoring in the game at third minute of play as she was able to collect a rebound off a penalty corner attempt. However moments later, the Buckeyes tied the game and then took the lead.

Ohio State's Saskia Mueller converted a penalty stroke eight minutes into the game to net the score at 1-1 and then Lucy Clayton converted a Buckeye penalty corner attempt to put her team up 2-1 by the 13th minute. From then on, the two teams would continue to trade goals throughout the half.

Old Dominion struck again three minutes later on Admiraal's second goal of the day. Admiraal broke open in the middle of the shooting circle and fired into the back of the cage to tie the game at 2-2. However, less than a minute later the Buckeyes struck again to take a 3-2 edge, this time as Yesenia Lucus deflected a pass into the cage.

Pinchbeck tied the game at 3-3 with her first goal of the afternoon and the final of the first half, coming at the 19th minute. The Suffolk, Virginia native collected another rebound off a Lady Monarch penalty corner attempt.

CAA Player of the Year, senior Janelle Engl, converted the day's second penalty corner attempt to give Old Dominion a 4-3 edge seven minutes into the second half of action. However, the lead was short lived as Lucus captured her second goal of the day racing into the center of the circle and getting the ball just over the top of ODU netminder Mary Cate Gordon. In the 57th minute of action, Old Dominion managed to penetrate the shooting circle for an attempt on net. Admiraal tried to reverse the ball as she headed to the left corner of the net, but the shot was not hard enough allowing the Buckeye's goalkeeper, Lindsay Williams to kick the ball out of play. However, Pinchbeck intercepted the loose ball and send it sailing into the back of the Ohio State net for the 5-4 advantage the Lady Monarchs would manage to hold to until the close of regulation.

Gordon made two stops in net for the Lady Monarchs, while her counterpart, Williams, posted six saves in the loss for the Buckeyes.

SECOND ROUND

The Old Dominion field hockey team went Final Four Bound for the 16th time in school history as the Lady Monarchs defeated Michigan, 3-2, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament held on the campus of Ohio State.

The Lady Monarchs though would keep control of the ball for much of the time left in regulation for the win.

Old Dominion outshot Michigan, 16-6, and outcornered their opponent, 6-4. Senior Mary Cate Gordon registered one save in the ODU victory, while the Wolverine's Beth Riley collected six stops in the loss.

Old Dominion vs. Maryland Louisville, KY. - November 18, 2005

The Old Dominion University field hockey team's season came to an end at Trager Stadium on the campus of the University of Louisville as the Lady Monarchs fell 3-2 to top seeded Maryland in the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament. The Lady Monarchs, who were making their 16th Final Four appearance, conclude the 2005 season with a 19-6 overall record.

Maryland took an early lead as Paula Infante intercepted the ball near midfield, entered the top of the circle and fired past ODU keeper Mary Cate Gordon four minutes into the contest. Gordon came up with five saves during that half to keep the score 1-0 heading into halftime. The Lady Monarchs were outshot 8-1 in the first 35 minutes of the game.

STATE COLLEGE, Va. -- The fourth ranked Old Dominion field hockey team improved to 2-0 on the young season as junior Sami McLenegan (Middletown, Pa.) posted her first career game-winner in the 6-1 victory over Ohio University in a neutral site game on the campus of Penn State.

McLanegan was one of two Lady Monarch multiple scorers joining senior **Dana Sensenig (Denver, Pa.)** with two tallies.

McLanegan gave Old Dominion a 2-0 lead in the first half. Her first goal came at the 10:17 mark as she tipped in a shot that came from the stick of teammate **Shannon Mobley (Va. Beach, Va.)**. Her second goal, the game-winner, came at the 27:22 mark as freshman **Katie Ueberroth (Stevens, Pa.)** drew out the Ohio keeper and passed the ball to McLanegan for a shot on an unprotected net.

The second half saw the Lady Monarch scoring barrage continue. Sensenig captured the second half's first goal by converting a penalty stroke at the 43:50 mark and then moments later recorded her second goal of the afternoon for a 4-0 ODU lead.

Sensenig would go on to record an assist on the next ODU goal. Senior **Anna Rogers (New Bloomfield, Pa.)** netted her first goal of the 2006 campaign as she took Sensenig's pass from the left side of the endline.
