ABOUT THE LADY MONARCH FIELD HOCKEY TEAM:



● **THIS IS HOW WE START:** Old Dominion started off the 2006 campaign with a 3-0 start, its best start to a season since they started off the 2002 Final Four season 3-0 as well. On Monday, defending national champions No. 1 Maryland put a halt to win streak in a thrilling 1-0 game. Ironically it was also Maryland, also ranked #1 at the time, who snapped the 2002 team's three game season opening win streak as well. In that game, the Lady Monarchs fell 0-2. During the win streak this season, Old Dominion downed two ranked opponents with a 3-1 win over #7 Penn State and a 3-2 victory over #19 Virginia. Also in the win streak was a 6-1 win over Ohio University, who was receiving votes in the NFHCA Poll.

● **WELCOME HOME:** Old Dominion opens up play at home this weekend for the first time this season as they take on #19 Richmond on Saturday and #20 Michigan on Sunday. The Lady Monarchs have one of the toughest home field turfs to play on. Last season, the Lady Monarchs boasted a 9-3 record with the two of the three losses coming against teams ranked in the top three.

● **NOTE ON THE NATIONAL STATS:** National statistics, compiled for the first time by the NCAA, will be released every Monday during the season, starting on Monday, September 11th. Statistics can be accessed at NCAA Field Hockey field hockey website at www.ncaasports.com/fieldhockey/womens.

● **LAST TIME VS. MICHIGAN:** The Old Dominion field hockey team was Final Four Bound for the 16th time in school history after their last meeting with Michigan as the Lady Monarchs defeated the Wolverines, 3-2, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament back on November 13th. The Lady Monarch never trailed in the contest, but the score was tied at 1-1 entering the half. Old Dominion struck first at the 21st minute as Darcy Pinckbeck received a feed from Nicolien van Nispen from the middle of the circle to open scoring. Four minutes later though, the Wolverines struck back as Erin Dallas tipped a pass from Mary Fox into the corner of the Lady Monarch cage. Twice Michigan found its way into the circle and looked like they had found the back of the Old Dominion cage, but both times were ruled no goal. Two minutes into the second half, Old Dominion struck again to take a lead they would never relinquish. On the first penalty corner of the second half of action, striker Janelle Engle passed the ball back to insert Dana Sensenig who fired it into the Michigan net. Old Dominion took a 3-1 edge at the 42nd minute. In a loose ball scramble in front of the cage, Katelyn Smither was the Old Dominion player to get a stick on the ball and tip it in. Michigan cut their deficit to one less than four minutes later on the option on the penalty corner. Kara Lentz passed off to Stephanie Hoyer who was waiting along the right side of the ODU cage to tip the ball in. The Lady Monarchs though would keep control of the ball for much of the time left in regulation for the win. Old Dominion outshot Michigan, 16-6, and outcornered their opponent, 6-4.

● **LAST TIME VS. RICHMOND:** The seventh-ranked Old Dominion University field hockey team used a balanced attack as a different Lady Monarch scored each goal in their 5-2 victory over #16 Richmond on September 24th at Crenshaw Field. The Lady Monarchs improved to 26-0 overall against the Spiders. Old Dominion jumped out to a 4-0 lead at the half, which proved to be too much for the Spiders to overcome. Anna Rogers put the Lady Monarchs onto the scoreboard first as she managed to lift the ball over Richmond keeper Becca Weaver 12 minutes into the game. Five minutes later, fellow classmate Darcy Pinckbeck gave ODU a 2-0 lead on an unassisted tally as she put away a deflection off Weaver. Dana Sensenig added to the lead at the 28-minute mark with her team-leading sixth goal of the season. Sensenig put away a penalty corner rebound with the assists credited to Shannon Mobley and Caroline Nichols. Katelyn Smither rounded out the ODU scoring in the first half. Former Jennifer Angat fed Smither the ball for her breakaway goal in the closing minutes of the half. Richmond broke the shutout over 21 minutes into the second half. Allie Howard notched her first goal of the year as she weaved her way through the Lady Monarch defense and found the back of the net from just inside the circle. Old Dominion responded less than four minutes later to take a 5-1 edge. Senior Janelle Engle joined Sensenig in the leading scorers column as she converted a penalty stroke for her sixth goal of the year. The stroke marked the Lady Monarchs' first of the 2005 season. The Spiders mustered one more goal with a little over seven minutes remaining in the game to bring the final score to 5-2. Ashley Barnes also registered her first goal of the year collecting a rebound off a penalty corner. In all, Old Dominion outshot Richmond, 20-9, and outcornered the Spiders, 7-4.

● **WELCOME BACK LYNN:** A familiar face will return to Foreman Field on Saturday. Lynn Farquhar, who played for Old Dominion 2001-04, will return to her alma mater as an assistant coach with the Richmond Spiders. Farquhar begins her second season on the staff after helping Richmond to a 16-6 overall record, 7-0 Atlantic-10 mark, and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. The three-time National Field Hockey Coaches Association All-Academic honoree at Old Dominion, she served as captain, was named Team MVP and Second Team All-South Region as a senior. During her career the Lady Monarchs went 69-25 with three CAA titles, four NCAA appearances, and a 2002 Final Four appearance.

● **REMATCH ON THE CALENDAR:** Old Dominion suffered its first loss of the 2006 season on Monday in a 1-0 defeat at No. 1 Maryland in what has become one of the premiere match-ups in collegiate field hockey. The Lady Monarchs will have a chance for revenge though at the Terps to Norfolk on Saturday, October 14th.

● **RANK 'EM UP:** So far to date the Lady Monarchs are 2-1 against ranked competition. ODU is 1-1 against Top Ten opponents with a win against #7 Penn State and a loss to #1 Maryland. Old Dominion will face ten ranked opponents according to the latest NFHCA Poll which will include this week's opponents in #19 Richmond and #20 Michigan along with #4 Duke, #5 North Carolina, #13 James Madison, #17 William & Mary, and #18 Northeastern.

● **KATIE UEERROTH NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:** Freshman Katie Ueberroth earned the Lady Monarchs first CAA weekly award as she was named the Rookie of the Week for the first week of the season. The freshman midfielder came off the Lady Monarch bench helping ODU to a 3-1 victory over #7 Penn State and a 6-1 win over Ohio with two goals and an assist. She tallied ODU's third and final goal against the Nittany Lions and then followed by assisting Sami McLenegan's game-winner in Sunday's win over Ohio and scoring the Lady Monarchs' sixth and final goal of the game.

● **THE WINNINGEST DIVISION I COACH:** At the helm of the Old Dominion women's field hockey program is the winningest Division I coach in history, Beth Anders. To date, Anders boasts a 464-79-7 overall mark and is only one of six coaches overall and active Division I coaches to reach the 400-win milestone. She entered the 2006 season as the all-time winningest Division I coach and third all-time winningest coach in NCAA history.

● **FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE NEWS - WORLD CUP:** USA Field Hockey and women's national team coach Lee Bodimeade have announced that two former Lady Monarchs will be among the 16-member team to represent the USA at next month's Samsung World Cup in Madrid, Spain. Honda Award winner Tiffany Snow and All-American Angie Loy will try to help the US team bring home gold beginning on September 27th. The USA will meet Argentina in the team's World Cup opener on Sept. 27 and will meet Australia in the second game on Sept. 28. The USA earned its first victory over Argentina in 16 years with a 2-1 win during the AstroTurf March on Madrid and earned a 1-1 draw with Australia during the first round of the event.

● **COMING UP:** Old Dominion takes to the road for their next five games. Next weekend will be the first of the home-and-home series with Duke and North Carolina. The Lady Monarchs take on fifth ranked Tar Heels on Saturday, September 16th and the fourth ranked Blue Devils on Sunday, September 17th. The following weekend will have Old Dominion renew its rivalry with Princeton in New Jersey and begin the CAA portion of its schedule with the conference opener at Drexel.

GAME-BY-GAME RESULTS:

GAME ONE:

No. 4 Old Dominion at No. 7 Penn State College Park, Pa. - August 26, 2006

The fourth ranked Old Dominion field hockey squad opened the 2006 season with a 3-1 victory over seventh ranked Penn State. The Lady Monarchs never trailed in the contest striking first with 10 minutes into the game and senior **Dana Sensenig (Denver, Pa.)** putting away the game-winner just before halftime.

Senior **Caroline Nichols (Va. Beach, Va.)** captured ODU's first goal of the season off the Lady Monarchs' first penalty corner attempt of the game. Nichols shot on goal where the ball deflected off Penn State netminder Jen Beaumont and into the net for the 1-0 lead. Sophomore Katelyn Smither (Suffolk, Va.) and Sensenig recorded the assist.

Sensenig would register what would become the eventual game-winner with less than a minute left in the first half. Junior **Shannon Mobley (Va. Beach, Va.)** fed Sensenig a pass near the left side of the cage for the 2-0 advantage.

Penn State thwarted the shutout in the early minutes of the second half. Natalie Blasco managed to intercept the ball from the Lady Monarchs to feed Annelise Legel for the score.

The Lady Monarchs did manage one more score before the end of the game with freshman **Katie Ueberroth (Stevens, Pa.)** found her way to the back of the Nittany Lion net in a scramble in front of the cage.

The teams were even in shots in the first half 4-4 but ODU outshot Penn State 7-3 in the second half and ended the game with an 11-7 advantage. The Nittany Lions were only able to take two shots that were not the result of penalty corners.

In net, **Kelly Driscoll (West Chester, Pa.)** picked up the win in her collegiate debut. Driscoll posted two saves, while her counterpart Beaumont stopped five Lady Monarch shots in the loss.

GAME TWO:

No. 4 Old Dominion vs. (RV) Ohio University College Park, Pa. - August 27, 2006

The fourth ranked Old Dominion field hockey team improved to 2-0 on the young season as junior Sami McLenegan (Middletown, Pa.) posted her first career game-winner in the 6-1 victory over Ohio University in a neutral site game on the campus of Penn State.

McLenegan was one of two Lady Monarch multiple scorers joining senior **Dana Sensenig (Denver, Pa.)** with two tallies.

McLenegan gave Old Dominion a 2-0 lead in the first half. Her first goal came at the 10:17 mark as she tipped in a shot that came from the stick of teammate **Shannon Mobley (Va. Beach, Va.)**. Her second goal, the game-winner, came at the 27:22 mark as freshman **Katie Ueberroth (Stevens, Pa.)** drew out the Ohio keeper and passed the ball to McLeneagan for a shot on an unprotected net.

GAME THREE:
