ABOUT THE LADY MONARCH FIELD HOCKEY TEAM:



● **ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Lady Monarchs embark on a five game road trip this week starting with a trip one state south to face #4 North Carolina and #5 Duke. So far this season Old Dominion in 3-1 on the road, including a neutral site meeting with Ohio. All together, in the next three weeks, the Lady Monarchs will have traveled to three states (North Carolina, New Jersey, Pennsylvania) and nearly 1,500 miles. Old Dominion returns on Sunday, October 1st against CAA opponent Towson.

● **SEE YA REAL SOON:** No matter the outcome of the games this weekend against North Carolina and Duke, the Lady Monarchs will see these two teams again. Along with Maryland, Old Dominion will has a home-and-home series with the two teams. Rematches will occur at Foreman Field on Sunday, October 15th for Duke on Saturday, October 28th for North

Carolina. Note: The home game against the Tar Heels will be the annual scholarship game with the \$5.00 admission to benefit the Intercollegiate Foundation for Field Hockey Scholarships.

● **NICHOLS NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Senior defender Caroline Nichols became the second Lady Monarch to earn a CAA weekly honor as she was named the conference's Player of the Week for the week ending September 10th. The senior defender anchored the Old Dominion backfield which boasted two shutouts last week, as the Lady Monarchs picked up two wins against ranked opponents. Nichols' defensive effort helped ODU to its first shutout in a 3-0 victory over #19 Richmond as the Spiders were held to four total shots including just one in the first half. She followed by helping the Lady Monarchs to back-to-back shutouts with a 2-0 victory over #20 Michigan. Along with helping to keep the Wolverines without a shot in the first half, Nichols captured the game-winner as she drilled home a shot on a Lady Monarch penalty corner attempt.

● **NICHOLS CLAIMS ANOTHER AWARD:** Not only was senior defender Caroline Nichols named the CAA Player of the Week for her efforts last week, she was also named to the Women's Field Hockey.com honor roll.

● **THIS IS HOW WE START:** Old Dominion started off the 2006 campaign with a 3-0 start, its best start to a season since they started off the 2002 Final Four season 3-0 as well. On Monday, defending national champions No. 1 Maryland put a halt to win streak in a thrilling 1-0 game. Ironically it was also Maryland, also ranked #1 at the time, who snapped the 2002 team's three game season opening win streak as well. In that game, the Lady Monarchs fell 0-2. During the win streak this season, Old Dominion downed two ranked opponents with a 3-1 win over #7 Penn State and a 3-2 victory over #19 Virginia. Also in the win streak was a 6-1 win over Ohio University, who was receiving votes in the NFHCA Poll. To date, the Lady Monarchs have a 5-1 record, which is still the best start since 2002 when the Lady Monarchs kicked off the season with the same mark.

● **WELCOME HOME:** Old Dominion opened up play at home last weekend picking up two ranked victories. The Lady Monarchs downed #19 Richmond, 3-0, and #20 Michigan, 2-0, for a 2-0 home record so far at Foreman Field this season. The Lady Monarchs have one of the toughest home field turfs to play on. Last season, the Lady Monarchs boasted a 9-3 record with the two of the three losses coming against teams ranked in the top three.

● **FACES IN THE CROWD:** Freshman Katie Ueberroth was featured in Sports Illustrated's September 18th issue in the weekly magazine's "Faces In the Crowd" feature. Ueberroth earned the honor after being name the CAA's Rookie of the Week the first week of the season. The freshman midfielder came off the Lady Monarch bench helping ODU to a 3-1 victory over #7 Penn State and a 6-1 win over Ohio with two goals and an assist. She tallied ODU's third and final goal against the Nittany Lions and then followed by assisting Sami McLenegan's game-winner in Sunday's win over Ohio and scoring the Lady Monarchs' sixth and final goal of the game.

● **LAST TIME VS. NORTH CAROLINA:** The seventh-ranked Old Dominion field hockey team took it to the nation's top scoring defense on October 29th at Foreman Field as they handed the fourth-ranked North Carolina Tar Heels a 5-0 shutout. The victory upped ODU's mark to 14-5 overall as the Lady Monarchs close out non-conference competition with a 7-5 mark. The Tar Heels, who led the nation in scoring defense allowing only an average of .720 goals per game entering Saturday's game, gave up the most goals of any game that season and the most to a Lady Monarch team since 2001. Additionally, it was Old Dominion's largest margin of victory against the Tar Heels since 1998 when Old Dominion downed North Carolina by five goals, 7-2, during the NCAA Tournament. On senior day, it was Janelle Engle who collected what would be the game-winner as she put away a penalty corner opportunity in the game in the 12th minute of action. Over the course of the next four minutes, Old Dominion would go up 3-0 on the Tar Heels from unassisted goals by Dana Sensenig and Sami McLenegan. In the second half, the Lady Monarchs put away two more from Sensenig, and Denise Admiraal (Heillo, Holland), with her 15th. In net, former keeper Mary Cate Gordon posted three saves to preserve her sixth shutout of the season. North Carolina's Katy Tran made two stops, while Marie Bounds made one save playing in the game's final 10 minute. Tran had entered the game leading the nation in goals against average and ranking second in save percentage. Overall, Old Dominion outshot North Carolina, 14-8, and outcornered the Tar Heels by one, 5-4.

● **LAST TIME VS. DUKE:** The eighth ranked Old Dominion field hockey team had its eight-game win streak come to a halt as the third ranked Duke Blue Devils came away with a 3-2 victory on October 16th at Foreman Field. The loss, which dropped the Lady Monarchs to 11-5 overall, was ODU's first loss since a September 17th loss at North Carolina. The win streak actually began against the Blue Devils as Old Dominion took the first of a home-and-home series, 5-2. The Blue Devils struck first, 3:50 into the contest. Kirsten Bostrom collected the ball to the right of the Lady Monarch net and send the ball across the opposite side of the cage to Nicole Dudek for the 1-0 Blue Devil lead. Old Dominion broke onto the scoreboard at the 12th minute on a penalty corner opportunity. Former Lady Monarch senior Janelle Engle fired away on net for her 14th tally of the 2005 season after the insert from Dana Sensenig and stick stop by Caroline Nichols. Dudek struck again at the 25th minute to give Duke the lead for good. Dudek intercepted a Lady Monarch pass and drove into the circle and past ODU keeper Mary Cate Gordon for a 2-1 Blue Devil edge at the half. Duke went up 3-1 at the 42nd minute in the second half thanks to Laura Suchoski finding a gap while on the right side of the circle. The Lady Monarchs pulled within one moments later. Nicolien van Nispen drilled the ball past Duke netminder Christy Morgan near the top left of the circle leaving ODU trailing 3-2 with 25:41 left in the game. Neither team could convert in the remaining time. The Lady Monarchs had several late chances, including two occasions in the closing minutes where the ball found the back of the Duke net, but was hit outside the circle. Duke held the advantage in shots 14-12, while Old Dominion held a slight edge in penalty corners, 5-4.

● **FAMILIAR FACE IN DURHAM:** Take a look at the sidelines in Durham and you might see a familiar Lady Monarch face on the sideline. Former midfielder Tara Herrmann ('03) is a volunteer assistant with the Duke Blue Devils. In her four years at ODU, Herrmann was a two-time All-CAA selection, a two-time all-region pick and a third-team All-American in 2001. She was named to the 2002-03 Verizon Academic All-America Women's At-Large third team and was a three-time NFHCA national scholar-athlete. Herrmann, a four-time CAA Scholar-Athlete, also earned the Jack Wilkins/James Howard Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award in 2003. Herrmann led the Lady Monarchs to fourth CAA titles and closed her career with 45 goals with nine assists (99 points). She helped guide Old Dominion to a No. 1 final ranking in the STX/NFHCA Div. 1 Coaches' Poll, the top seed in the 2002 NCAA Tournament and the program's 15th Final Four appearance. She graduated from Old Dominion in 2003 with a 3.94 grade-point average, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in biology with a minor in chemistry. Three of the last four weeks there have been a ODU coaching connecting. Penn State, who ODU opened the season against, is coached by Char Morrett, a former ODU assistant, and last weekend Lynn Farquhar ('04) returned to Foreman Field as an assistant coach with the University of Richmond.

● **REMATCH ON THE CALENDAR:** Old Dominion suffered its first loss of the 2006 season on Monday in a 1-0 defeat at No. 1 Maryland in what has become one of the premiere match-ups in collegiate field hockey. The Lady Monarchs will have a chance for revenge though at the Terps to Norfolk on Saturday, October 14th.

● **RANK 'EM UP:** So far to date the Lady Monarchs are 4-1 against ranked competition and 3-1 against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the polls. ODU is 1-1 against Top Ten opponents with a win against #7 Penn State and a loss to

#1 Maryland. Old Dominion still has three more ranked opponents according to the latest NFHCA Poll on the schedule with #13 James Madison, #17 William & Mary, and #18 Hofstra along with rematches against #1 Maryland, #4 North Carolina, and #5 Duke.

- **KATIE UEBERROTH NAMED CAA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK:** Freshman Katie Ueberroth earned the Lady Monarchs first CAA weekly award as she was named the Rookie of the Week for the first week of the season. The freshman midfielder came off the Lady Monarch bench helping ODU to a 3-1 victory over #7 Penn State and a 6-1 win over Ohio with two goals and an assist. She tallied ODU's third and final goal against the Nittany Lions and then followed by assisting Sami McLenegan's game-winner in Sunday's win over Ohio and scoring the Lady Monarchs' sixth and final goal of the game.

- **THE WINNINGEST DIVISION I COACH:** At the helm of the Old Dominion women's field hockey program is the winningest Division I coach in history, Beth Anders. To date, Anders boasts a 466-79-7 overall mark and is only one of six coaches overall and active Division I coaches to reach the 400-win milestone. She entered the 2006 season as the all-time winningest Division I coach and third all-time winningest coach in NCAA history.

- **FORMER LADY MONARCHS IN THE NEWS - WORLD CUP:** USA Field Hockey and women's national team coach Lee Bodimeade have announced that three former Lady Monarchs will be among the 18-member team to represent the USA at next month's Samsung World Cup in Madrid, Spain. Honda Award winner Tiffany Snow, All-American Angie Loy, and defensive specialist Melissa Leonetti will try to help the US team bring home gold beginning on September 27th. The USA will meet Argentina in the team's World Cup opener on Sept. 27 and will meet Australia in the second game on Sept. 28. The USA earned its first victory over Argentina in 16 years with a 2-1 win during the AstroTurf March on Madrid and earned a 1-1 draw with Australia during the first round of the event.

- **COMING UP:** Old Dominion is on the road again as they renew a rivalry with Princeton on Saturday, September 23rd and open up Colonial Athletic Association action against Drexel in Philadelphia. The Dragons are one of the hottest teams in the conference entering this weekend with a 5-0 mark.

GAME ONE:

No. 4 Old Dominion at No. 7 Penn State College Park, Pa. - August 26, 2006

The fourth ranked Old Dominion field hockey squad opened the 2006 season with a 3-1 victory over seventh ranked Penn State. The Lady Monarchs never trailed in the contest striking first with 10 minutes into the game and senior **Dana Sensenig (Denver, Pa.)** putting away the game-winner just before halftime.

GAME TWO:

No. 4 Old Dominion vs. (RV) Ohio University College Park, Pa. - August 27, 2006

The fourth ranked Old Dominion field hockey team improved to 2-0 on the young season as junior Sami McLenegan (Middletown, Pa.) posted her first career game-winner in the 6-1 victory over Ohio University in a neutral site game on the campus of Penn State.
