MONARCH MOMENTS:

The Monarchs make history on September 5th when a three-year dream becomes a reality. On May 31, 2006, the ODU board of visitors voted to add football and 1,293 days later, the Monarchs are about to kick-off. ODU has an 11-game schedule, including seven home dates at the \$24.8 million renovated Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium. The schedule is a mix of both D-II and D-I FCS opponents to help the

69 YEARS IN THE MAKING:

Old Dominion last fielded a football team in 1940, back when the school was known as the Norfolk Division of the College of William & Mary. Then known as the Braves, the Norfolk Division had its first football game on Sept. 26, 1930 and was then disbanded in 1940. On June 21, 2005 by a 14-0 vote, the ODU board of visitors approved a plan that would see NCAA Div. I-AA (now known as FCS) football played at a remodeled Foreman Field provided that:

- ◆ A consultant's report indicating community support for a program.
- ◆ The acquisition of land to meet practice and other athletic needs
- ◆ Pledges of at least \$8 million for a football endowment

All three criteria were met and Old Dominion kicks off today.

TOUGHEST TICKET IN TOWN:

ODU's first contest vs. Chowan is sold out. Response for Monarch football has been overwhelming:

- ◆ 14,377 season tickets sold with season ticket applications made available in Feb. 2008.
- ◆ The school had to unfortunately turn away 296 season ticket orders for a total of 1,065 season tickets due to demand.
- ◆ The ODU student ticket allotment of just under 4,000 tickets were all distributed in three days. Over 1,200 ODU students were in line when distribution began on Monday, August 24th at 8 a.m. and over 2,500 student tickets were handed out on the first day. By Tuesday night, only approximately 100 student tickets were available.

ABOUT CHOWAN:

- ◆ Division II Chowan University opened with 2009 slate last Thursday with a 36-21 loss to #19 Albany State.
- ◆ The Hawks finished 2008 at 2-8 overall. They return 48 letterwinners.
- ◆ Albany State took advantage of six Chowan turnovers in the game, putting up 24 points on the Hawks' miscues.
- ◆ Albany State took advantage of six Chowan turnovers in the game, putting up 24 points on the Hawks' miscues.
- ◆ Chowan tallied 257 yards of offense in the game, 205 yards through the air and 52 yards gained on the ground.
- ◆ Hawk quarterback CJ Westler tossed three touchdowns while also throwing three interceptions in the loss. He completed 20-of-37 passes in the game.
- ◆ Elliot Smalls led the ground attack for Chowan with 37 yards on seven carries. Kevin Robledo finished the game with two touchdowns and 106 receiving yards on seven catches.
- ◆ Defensively, Chowan's Brad Cash and Andrae DeWeese had 4.5 tackles each while Greg Palmer had three tackles with a sack.
- ◆ Dennis Helsel, who enters his third year as the Director of Athletics for Chowan University, spent five years at Old Dominion as the Assistant Athletic Director for Business.

FROM DREAMS TO REALITY Foreman Field at S.B. Ballard Stadium

Foreman Field was named after Norfolk attorney A.H. Foreman, a member of William and Mary's board of visitors and one of the founders of the Norfolk Division of William & Mary, which later became Old Dominion University.

Originally intended as the home of the Norfolk Division football program, it found new life as the home to other college and community sports programs when football was originally dropped in 1941. Built in 1936, with state and federal funds provided during the Great Depression, Foreman Field has undergone a \$24.8 million dollar renovation over the last year with the help of SB Ballard Construction Company and Clark Nexsen Architecture and Engineering.

The renovation to the game day home of the football Monarchs includes a new state-of-the-art game day building, field surface, scoreboard, sound system, field enclosure and a contiguous parking garage.

The Ainslie Football Complex features 26 luxury suites and 390 loge seats in 100 mini boxes, in addition to recruiting and

hospitality facilities and game day locker rooms for Monarch student-athletes and coaches. Twelve of the suites have their own patio overlooking the plaza south of the complex, while the loge seating area also includes an 8,000 square foot covered patio on the second level of the facility. Another 7,500 square foot enclosed terrace looks directly out over the south end zone. The playing surface at Foreman Field has been replaced by Astroturf GameDay Grass 3D.

The stadium has been named S.B. Ballard Stadium at Foreman Field in honor of Stephen and B.J. Ballard and SB Construction, the company responsible for many on-campus construction projects, including Foreman Field. The Ainslie Football Complex, the new game-day building that houses concessions and suites, has been named for Jeffrey W. Ainslie ('83). The Alcaraz-Weinstein Family Plaza, the plaza entrance for the Monarch football team and fans, is in honor of the Gary Alcaraz ('84) and Lee Weinstein families.

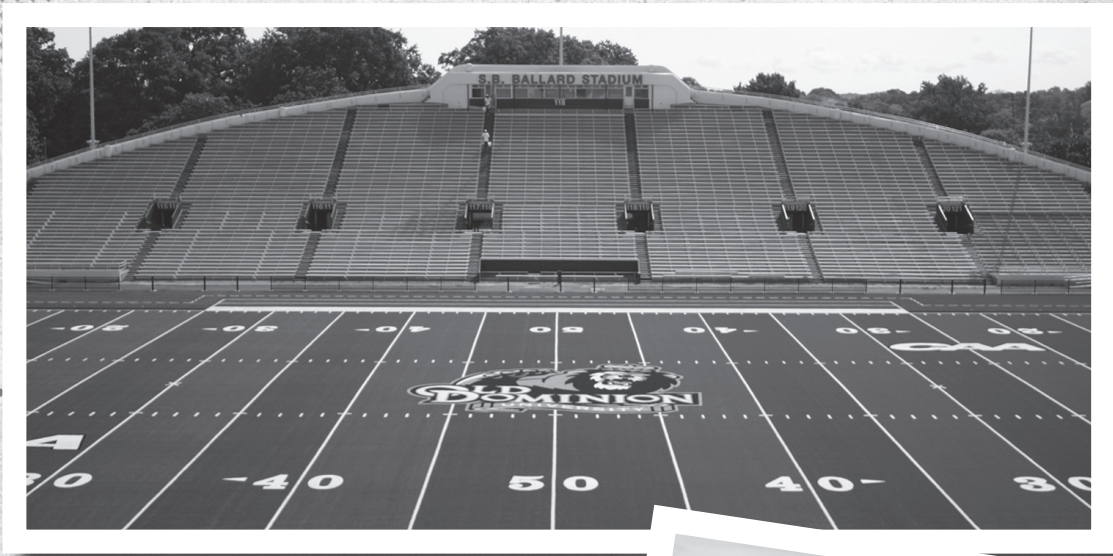
